Headline Statistics

DYFED-POWYS POLICE

June 2004

Recorded Crime:

- Total Recorded Crime is up by **31%** (+2,034 crimes) compared to the same period last year (SPLY) to stand at **8,611** crimes (17.6 per 1,000 population).
- Recorded detection performance remains down, with the detection rate for the force at **38.1%** (3,278 detections) – with the volume decreasing by **3%** (-182 detections). This remains below the detection target of 50%.
- Estimates that exclude the impact of NCRS on recorded crimes indicate that between 18% and 30% of the current total levels can be attributed to this change. In contrast to recent months, monthly crimes for June 2004 were 2.5% above the same month last year.

Domestic Burglary:

- Domestic Burglaries are up by 69 crimes or **35%** compared to the previous year to stand at 264, with a detection rate of **25.4%** (67 detections). This is a small decrease on the same period for the previous year (28%).
- The volume of detections has, however, increased by 12 (22%). Ceredigion currently has the highest detection rate, standing at **32%**. It is estimated that between 18% and 30% of current total burglary (including domestic and other burglary) may be the result of NCRS changes.

Violent Crimes:

- Total Violent Crime is up by **47%** (+776 crimes) to stand at 2,422 crimes. Levels of Serious Violent Crime (section 18,20 & 47) have increased compared with the same period last year (+23%) – attributable to Other Wounding '08A' – to stand at 1,081 crimes. NCRS related changes are responsible for somewhere between 24% and 37% of current total numbers of violent crimes recorded.

Autocrime:

- Autocrime is up on the previous year (+**12%**/66 crimes) to stand at **610**, with increases recorded in Ceredigion (up 50%/+19 crimes) and Pembrokeshire (up 54%/47 crimes). These increases counter falling levels of autocrime in Powys (-7%/-9 crimes).
- Detection performance at **17%** (103 detections) is down on last year (38%) and below the 30% annual force target. In more general terms it is estimated between 16% and 28% of current total theft recorded is due to changes arising from NCRS.

Criminal Damage:

- Criminal Damage has recorded an increase of **63%** in April - June 2004 (+872 crimes) compared with the same period last year (April – June 2003) to stand at 2,250 crimes. It is estimated that NCRS changes are responsible for between 35% and 47% of the current recorded crime levels.
- The detection rate has decreased, against an increase in criminal damage offences, standing at **23%** (521 detections), compared with 31% for the previous year.

Drug Offences:

- Total Drug trafficking offences show a decrease of **32%** compared with last year (down 22 offences to 45). Possession of Drug offences (including cannabis) also recorded a **21%** decrease for April - June 2004 (equating to 122 fewer crimes than April - June 2003) to stand at 474 for the year to date.
- The number of offenders dealt with for trafficking class-A drugs stands at **31** (up from 30 for the same period last year) with cocaine offenders falling by 4 to stand at 1, and Heroin offenders standing at 16 – compared with 21 for the period April – June 2003.
- The instances of drug seizure are down **36%** (-264 seizures) on last year, with a total for April – June 2004 of 477 seizures. Three cocaine seizures were recorded during April – June 2004 (the same as April – June 2003). Ecstasy seizures remain substantially down - by 23% (a total of 23 seizures during April – June 2004) compared with 19 for the same period last year. Cannabis seizures are down by 37% over the period.

Total Recorded Crime

Recorded Crime - Annual Trends

Total recorded crime for April – June 2004 stands at 8,611 offences – a figure that is 31% (+2,034 crimes) higher than the same period last year.

All the divisions recorded substantial increases - the smallest in Ceredigion (+12%), with greater increases still being recorded in Powys (+31%), Pembrokeshire (+33%), and Carmarthenshire (+37%).

The monthly figure for June 2004 indicates that the effects of NCRS on increasing levels of recorded offences has stabilised. Monthly crimes for June 2004 (2,630) are up only 2.5% on the same month in 2003.

In Carmarthenshire and Ceredigion the monthly total for June 2004 are smaller than the previous year (monthly crimes down by –4% and –2% respectively).

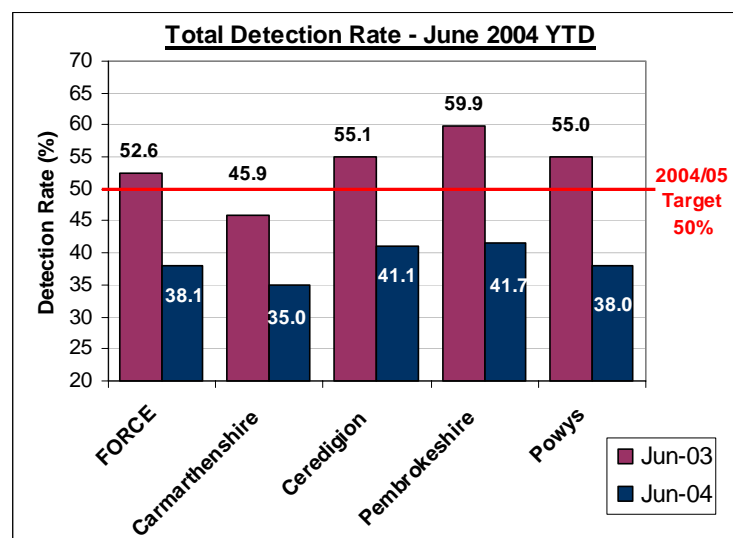
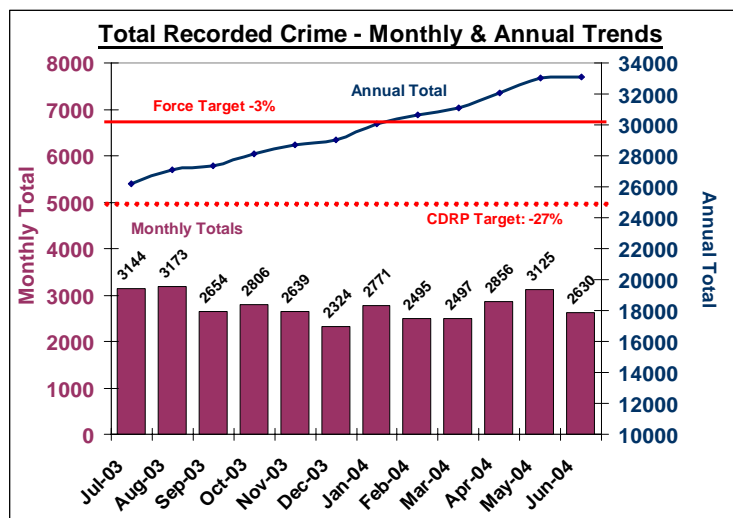
Detection Performance 2004/05

The current overall detection rate for 2004-05 is 38.1% - a significant decrease on the 52.6% recorded for the same period last year.

The volume of crimes detected is currently below the previous year – having decreased by 5.3% (-182 detections) to stand at 3,278 detections during April - June 2004.

As in previous months this reflects the general increase in crime levels, compounded by the fact that many of these additional crimes recorded can be far more difficult to detect.

The divisions continue to show a slight variation in performance, with all illustrating a similar scale of fall in detection rate. Pembrokeshire and Ceredigion currently record the highest rate at 42% and 41% respectively.

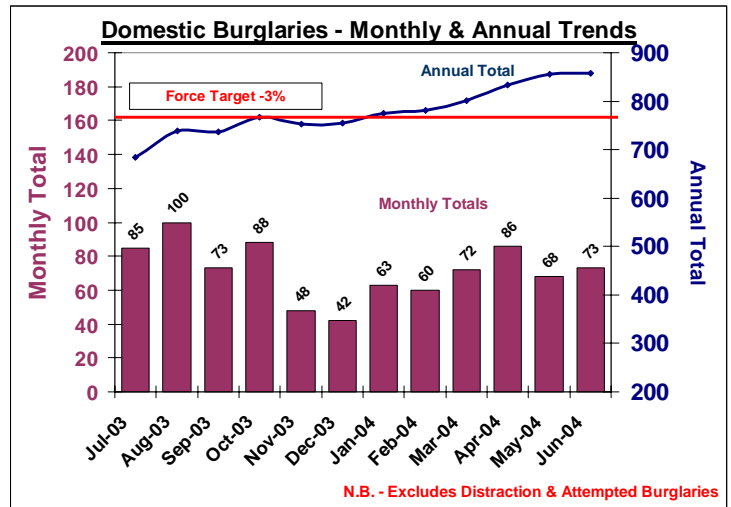

Recorded Crime - Annual Trends

The total recorded domestic burglaries for 2004-05 currently stands at 264 crimes, an increase of 35% (+69 crimes) compared to the same period last year.

As in previous months the variation in divisional performance remains – with Carmarthenshire recording a 75% increase (+29 crimes) in contrast to the decrease of 19% (-6 crimes) recorded in Ceredigion.

The monthly figures again illustrate a stable level of performance – in contrast to recent months. Crimes stood at 82 crimes (all domestic burglary offences) for the month of June 2004, an increase of only 1 crime on the same month in 2003.

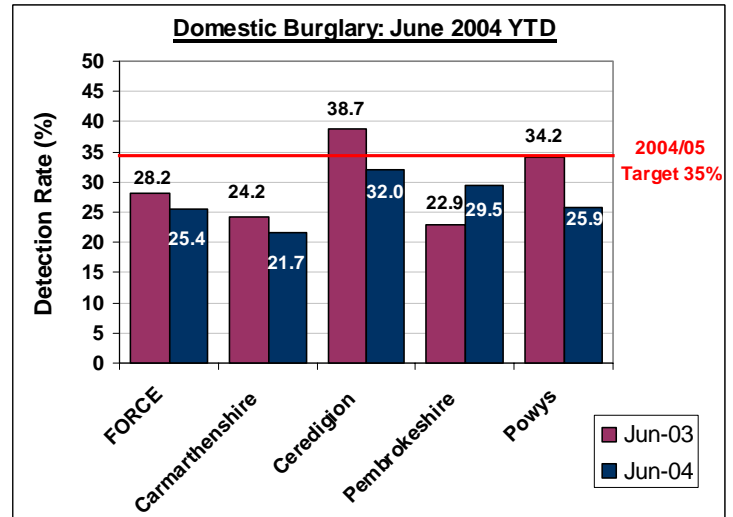


Detection Performance 2004/05

A detection rate of 25.4% is currently being recorded for the period April-June 2004, compared with 28.2% for the previous year. It is worth noting that the monthly detection performance for June stands at 28% compared with 18% for June 2003.

The volume of detections reflects the increase of offences - up by 12 detections to stand at 67 detections for the period.

Among the divisions, Pembrokeshire (30%) is notable in continuing to show an improved performance compared with the previous year. However, it is Ceredigion (32%) that is the highest performing division – although below the target of 35%.



Distraction Burglaries 2004/05

Recorded levels of distraction burglaries stand at 5 crimes (one detected) for the period April – June 2004, which is two fewer than during the same period last year. These offences were committed in Carmarthenshire (2), Pembrokeshire (2) and Powys (1).

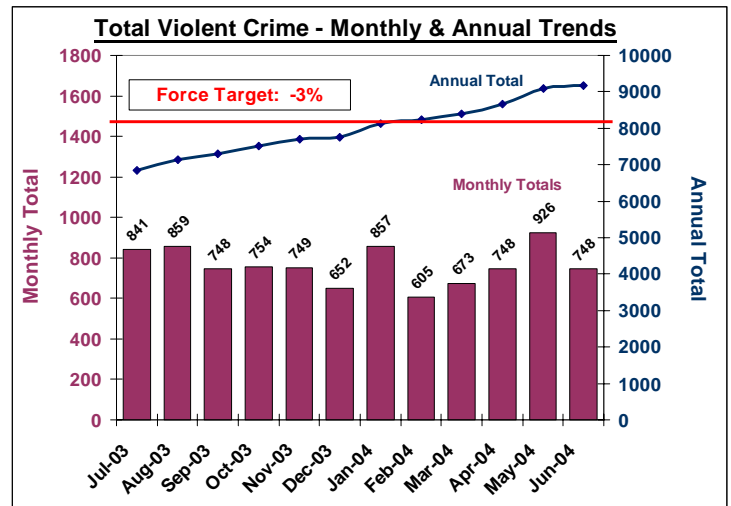
Total Violent Crime - Annual Trends

Total crimes for 2004–05 stand at 2,422 offences, an increase of 776 offences (+47.1%) compared with this time the previous year (April – June 2003).

Rates of increase vary across the divisions, with a relatively large rise in Carmarthenshire of 74% (up 414 crimes) compared with an increase of only 6% in Ceredigion (up by 19 offences).

Unlike other offence categories, the monthly levels of offences remain up on the previous year. Force violent crime in June 2003 was up 12% on the same month in 2003 – with Ceredigion the only area to show a fall with monthly offences down by 13%.

The number of sexual offences is recorded as 144 crimes for the period - an increase of 63 offences (+78%) on the same period last year. Robberies stand at 10 offences – down 2 (-20%) on this time last year.



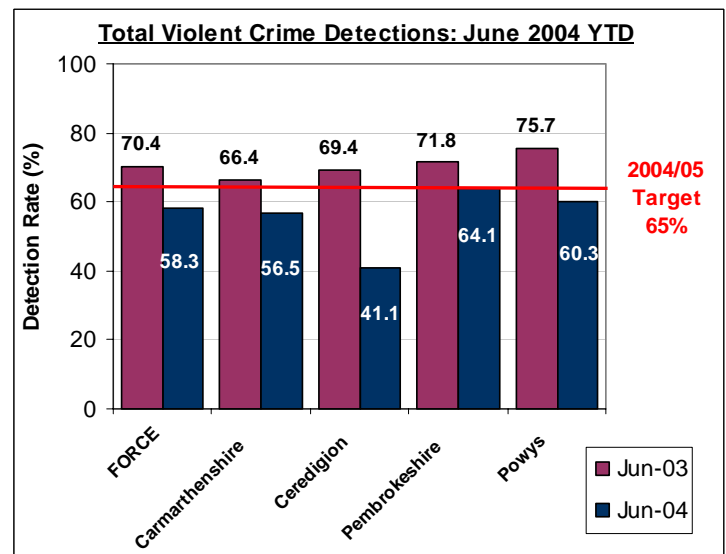
Detection Performance 2004/05 (April - June)

The detection performance stands at 58% for 2004-05. This is a reduction on the on the 70% recorded for the same period last year and below the established target of 65%.

The volume of detections is up by 22% (+254 detections) compared with the previous year to stand at 1,413 detected violent crimes.

All divisions have recorded a reduction in recorded detection performance. For example Ceredigion records the largest reduction with detection falling from 69% to 41% - against a background of the smallest increase in offences.

Performance in Powys is notable in that the area is recording both a notable fall in recorded detection rate (-15% to 60%) and a sharp increase in recorded violent offences (+31%).

Serious Violent Crime

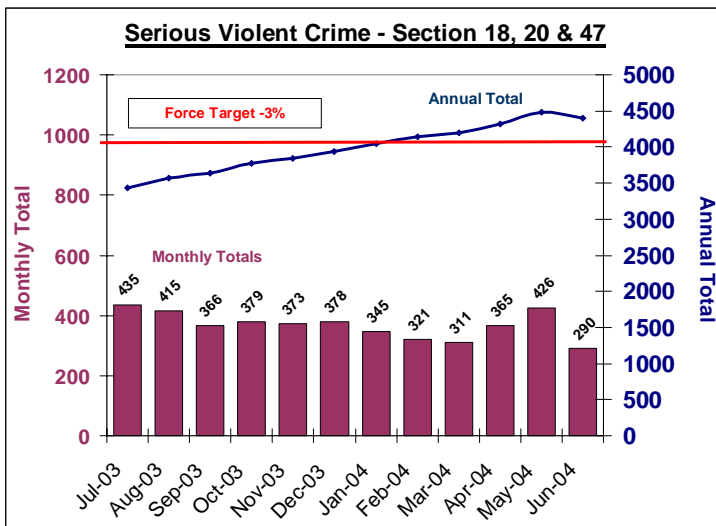
Serious Violent Crime – Sections 18, 20 & 47

This category includes wounding offences covered by sections 18, 20 and 47. Total for the period April - June 2004 stands at 1081 offences, an increase of +23% (+204 offences) on those recorded in the previous year.

Carmarthenshire recorded offences up by 46% on the same period last year and Pembrokeshire up by 31%. In contrast Ceredigion saw a notable reduction in offences – down by 10% compared with the same quarter last year.

In addition offences for the month of June 2004 record a substantial reduction of 21% on the same month in 2003 – down from 365 to 290 monthly offences.

The number of offences for the 12-month period ending June 2004 stands at 4,404 – an increase of 36% on the preceding 12-month period. However recording and classification changes in the last few years mean some caution is needed when interpreting performance.



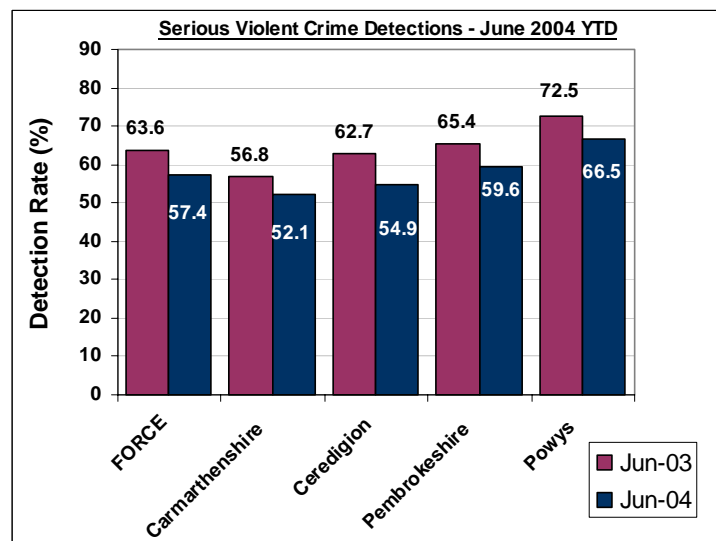
Detection Performance 2004/05 - June 2004 YTD

The period April – June 2004 records a detection rate of 57% for serious violent crime, compared to around 64% achieved during the same period last year.

This fall in apparent detection performance is set against an increase in the number of detections by 11% to stand at 620 for the period from 558 for the same period last year.

Levels of detection performance have fallen across the force by similar margins. Carmarthenshire is recording an increase in offences and fall in detection rate, but it is Ceredigion that records the sharpest reduction in recorded detection performance – down by 8% to 55%.

Detection rates for serious violent crimes remain characteristically lower than those for total violent crime across the divisions.

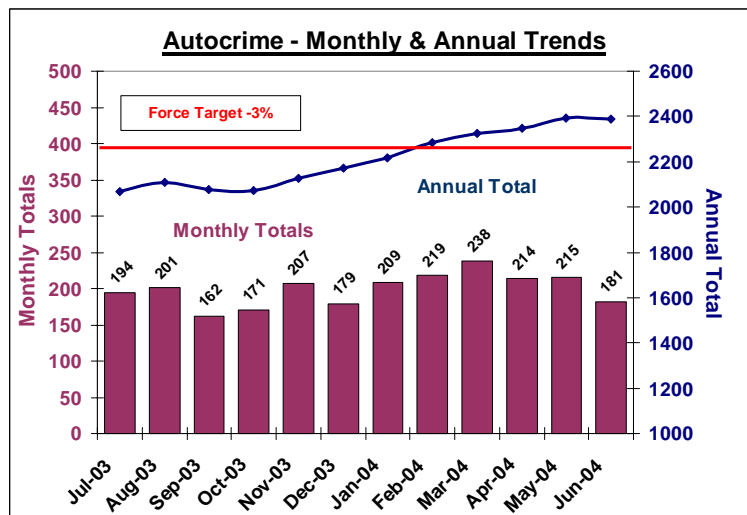
Autocrime - Annual Trends

Total offences stand at 610 for the period April - June 2004, an increase of 12% (+66 offences) on the previous year.

Ceredigion and Pembrokeshire are currently recording notable increases - with offences up 50% and 54% respectively. In contrast Powys recorded a reduction of 7% compared with the same period last year.

The total number of offences for the year-ending June 2004 stands at 2,390, an increase of 16% on the preceding 12-month period.

However, the monthly number of offences saw a small reduction - recording 181 in the month of June 2004 - down 2% on June 2003.



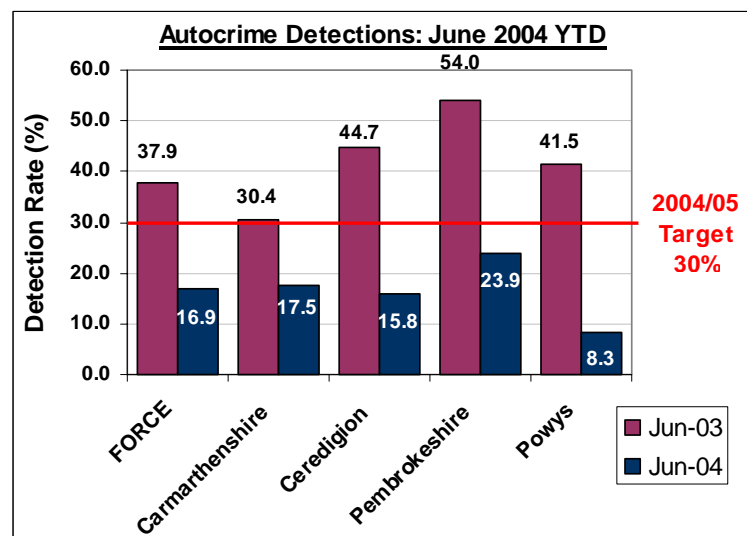
Detection Performance 2004/05

Detection performance stands at 17% for April - June 2004. This is below the target of 30% and a decrease on the 38% recorded for the same period last year.

Compounding this, the volume of detections recorded has also fallen by half over the period (-50% or 103 detections).

Recorded performance across the force is recording substantial reductions in detection rate - with Powys seeing rates fall from 42% last year to 8% for the period April-June 2004.

Powys is notable in recording a 7% reduction in offences but a sharp reduction in detection rate and 81% fall in the volume of detections over the period.

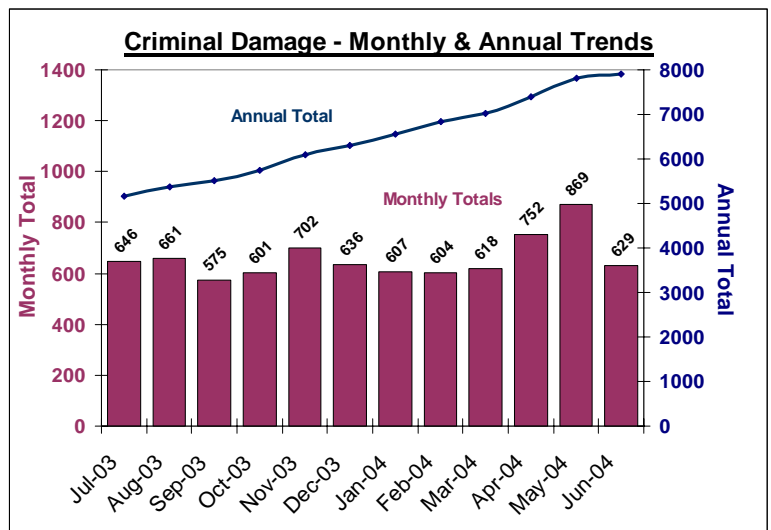
Criminal Damage - Annual Trends

A total 2,250 offences were recorded in April – June 2004, an increase of 63% in criminal damage offences (+872 offences) compared with last year.

Increases in recorded totals remain evident across the force area, up 68% in Carmarthenshire and 89% in Powys, supplemented by increases of 56% in Pembrokeshire and 29% in Ceredigion.

Offences for the year-ending June 2004 stands at 7,900, an increase of 60% on the preceding 12-months.

In addition monthly offences for June 2004 stand at 629 and increase of 16% on the same month in 2003.



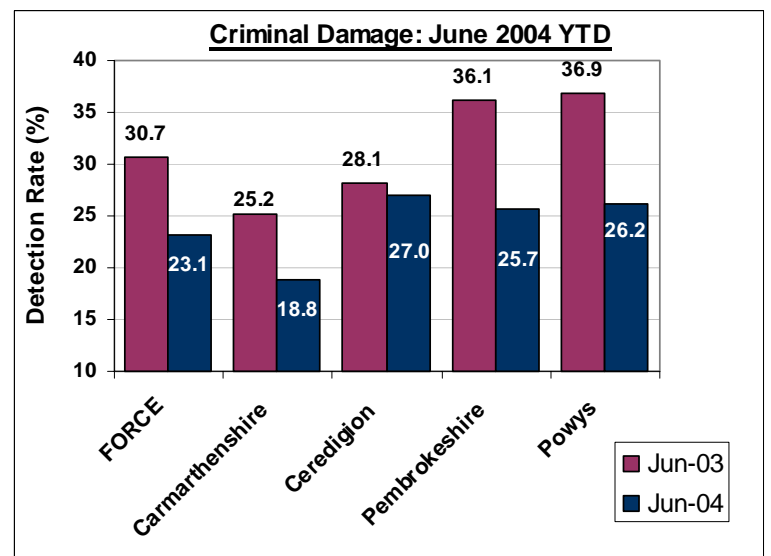
Detection Performance 2004/05

The detection rate has fallen from the previous year – standing at 26% for April - June 2004 compared with 37% for the same period last year.

Reflecting the increase in offences, the volume of detections has correspondingly risen by 23% this year (97 more detections) to stand at 521 detections for the period April – June 2004.

Pembrokeshire and Powys recorded almost identical reductions in recorded detection performance – both down from 37% to 26%. Ceredigion is notable recording no significant difference in detection performance – down from 28% to 27%.

As mentioned previously, increasing crime levels are compounded by the nature of the additional crimes being recorded that in many instances make them more difficult to detect.

Scientific Support Unit (SSU)

Scientific Support Unit (SSU) Function

The unit assists the collation and preservation of fingerprint, photographic and other forensic evidence. The recovery of fingerprints from the crime scene is performed by one of the 12 Scientific Support Officers (SSO) or by a designated Scene Examiner (SE).

Following arrival at the unit the material is checked and recorded at the administration section and from here is distributed to the appropriate section within the unit.

Items handled at the scene will be examined in the Fingerprint Development Unit by one of two trained staff. Finally the photographed marks will be transferred to our Fingerprint Bureau where three experts work independently on these images to provide identification in accordance with Nationally Approved Standards.

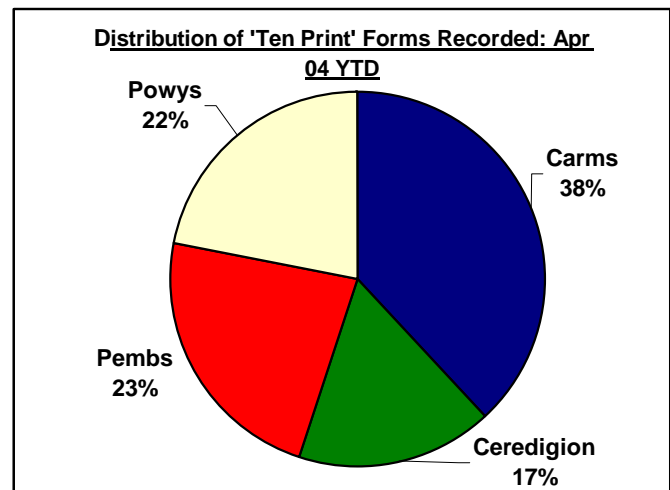
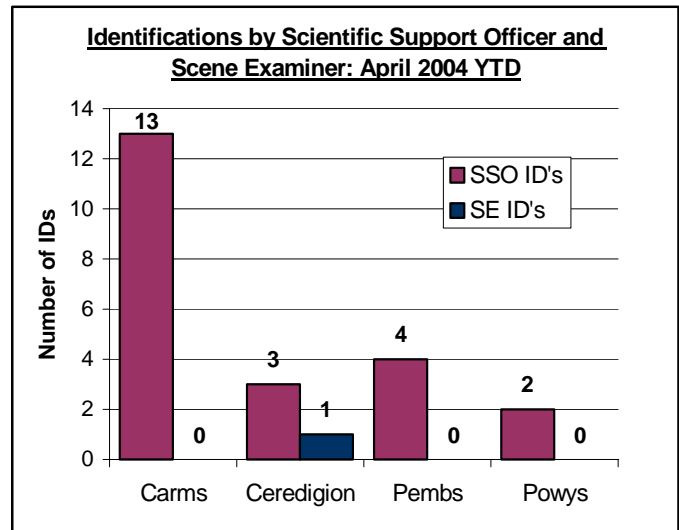
The number of identifications for April 2004 stand at 23 - the majority in Carmarthenshire (56% of ID's compared with 44% of total recorded crimes).

Of the total identifications, Scientific Support Officers (SSO) completed 96%, with the remaining 4% attributable to the Scene Examiner (SE). The total number of fingerprint development unit identifications conducted (FDU) stands at 10 for the year-to-date - this represents 43% of the total.

Of the total number of 51 DNA matches completed during the period (April 2004), 82% involved matches out of force. In addition 56 forensic submissions have been made during April 2004.

A total of 632 CJ samples have been received at HQ - of which 50% (318) have been sent to a laboratory for further tests.

It is worth re-iterating that a number of individuals can be involved with these processes.

Drug Statistics Update

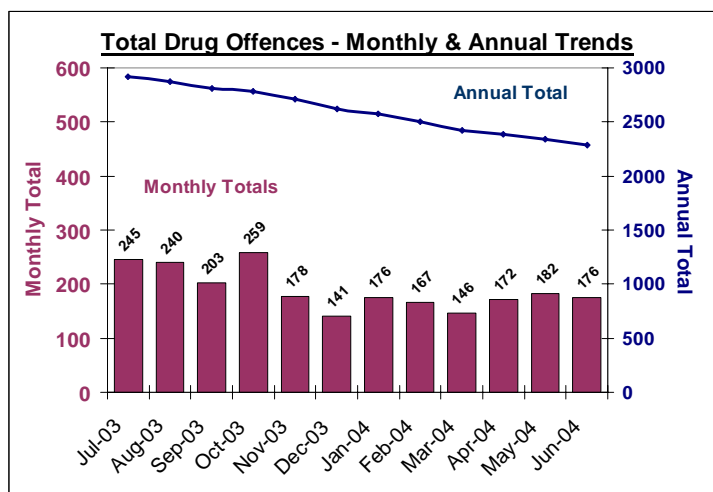
April – June 2004

All Drug Offences

The number of recorded offences for April - June 2004 stand at a total of 530 – a decrease of 20% (-135 crimes) on the same period last year.

Performance at divisional level continues to show sharp variation with decreases of 14% in Pembrokeshire and 27% in Carmarthenshire. A much larger fall was seen in Powys (-46%) and contrasts with a 25% increase in Ceredigion.

Trafficking offences have fallen by 32% over the period, with possession offences now subject to changes in recorded performance arising from the reclassification of cannabis. Total possessions (including cannabis) are down 20% on the previous year at 474 offences.



Drug Trafficking & Possession (2004 YTD)

- The current level of 'Trafficking in Controlled Drugs' (HO Class 92A) **offences** stands at 45 for the period April – June 2004, a fall of 32% (-22 offences) on the same period last year.
- 'Possession of Cannabis' and 'Other Drug Possession' (classification 92D and 92E) have fallen collectively by 20.5%, with **474** recorded during April – June 2004, a decrease of 122 offences compared with the previous year. As reported in previous months, collective drug/Cannabis possession offences in Powys are down by a notable 49% - compared to a rise of 24% in Ceredigion.
- **Class A drugs (April – June 2004):**
 - For the 45 trafficking offences recorded during April - June 2004, relate to 37 individual offenders (there are more offences than offenders since they may be jointly charged for the same offence). There were 31 offenders charged for trafficking Class-A drugs, and increase of 1 offender on the 30 recorded for the same period last year
 - There has been **1** offender dealt with for trafficking Cocaine (compared to 5 last year) while Heroin offenders charged now stands at **16**, (down from 21 last year). Ecstasy offenders currently stand at **11** – up from 6 the previous year.

Drug Seizures

- The fall in seizures reported during recent months has continued with a 36% reduction in April – June 2004 compared with the previous year. This has eased a little from the 42% annual reduction being recorded last month. It is worth continuing to note that while the frequency of individual seizures of Cannabis is down (-37%) the volume of drugs seized has increased notably.

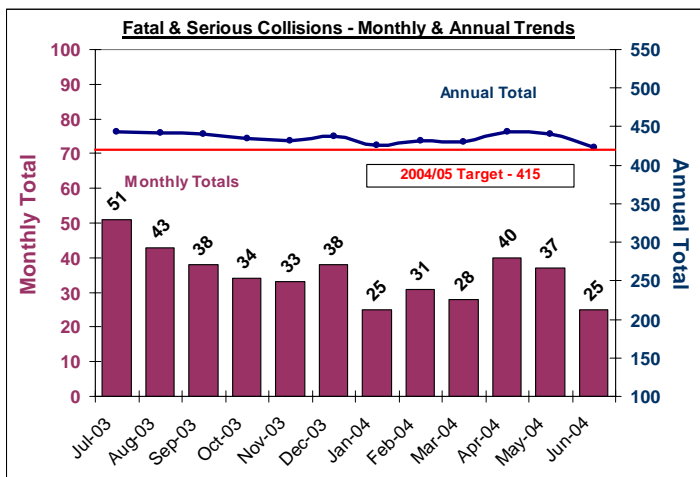
Serious and Fatal Collisions – Annual Trends

The total level of fatal collisions currently stands at 11 for April - June 2004, the same number recorded during the same period last year.

The total levels of serious and fatal collisions currently stand at 102 for April - June 2004, down by 6% on the previous year (109 collisions). This is consistent with the target for the period of 0.21 per 1,000 population or 106 collisions.

The year ending June 2004 is currently recording a provisional total of 423 serious and fatal collisions – a 4% fall on the preceding 12-months.

Fatal and serious collision have reduced by 15% in Powys and 27% in Pembrokeshire while increasing by 7% in Carmarthenshire. Powys has seen a fall in fatalities from 7 to 3 for the first quarter, while in contrast Carmarthenshire has increased to 4 for the period.



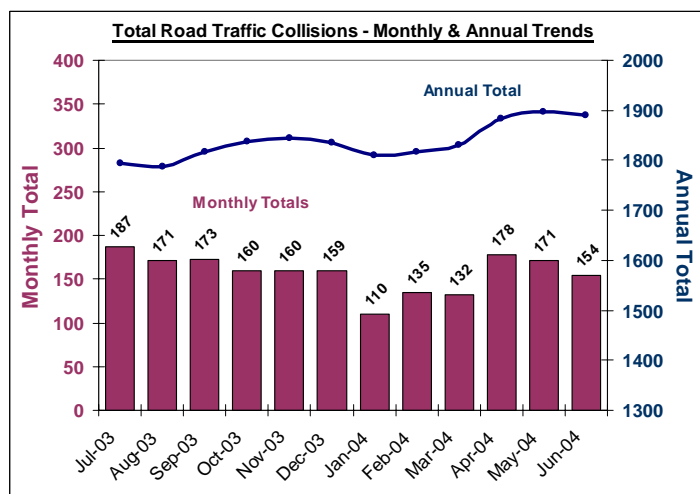
Total Road Traffic Collisions – Annual Trends

The total number of collisions (including slight) recorded during April - June 2004 stands at 503 – an increase of 14% or 60 collisions on the same period last year.

Total collisions are currently recording an increase across the force area, but particular in Powys and Ceredigion - where levels rose by 23% and 22% respectively. Levels in Carmarthenshire increased by a more modest 6% and by 8% in Pembrokeshire.

Total collisions for the year ending June 2004 stand at 1,890 - an increase of 7% on the preceding 12-month period.

Medium term trends in total collision numbers have increased gradually throughout the year. This remains a concern, notwithstanding the fall in serious and fatal collisions.

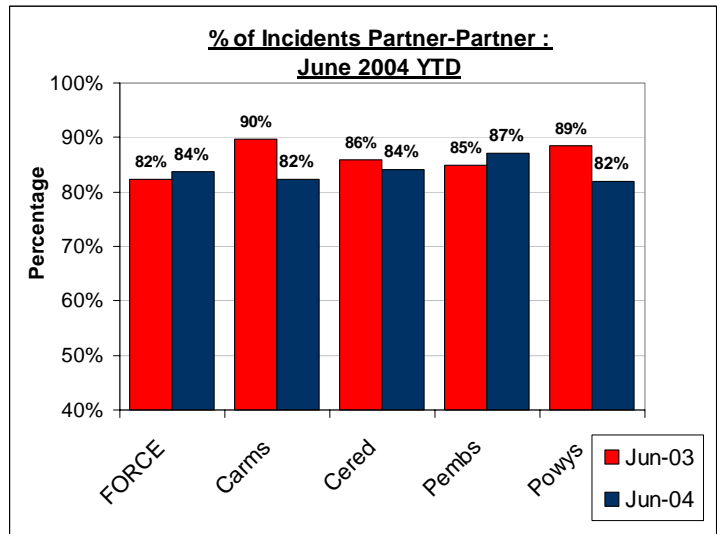
% Partner/Partner Incidents: June 2004 YTD

The total incidents recorded stands at 955 incidents for the period April-June 2004 – an 8% increase on the same period last year (+71 incidents).

In contrast the total level of arrests arising from these incidents has fallen by 8% to stand at 283 (compared with 306 last year). The % of arrests where a power of arrest occurs has is stable at 81% (82% last year).

The proportion of incidents attributable to partner-partner (both current and former) conflict stands at 84% - an increase on the 82% last year. In addition, the volume of partner related incidents have increased by 3% over the period.

Carmarthenshire and Powys continue to record notable reductions in the % of incidents that involve partners – both at 82% from 90% last year.



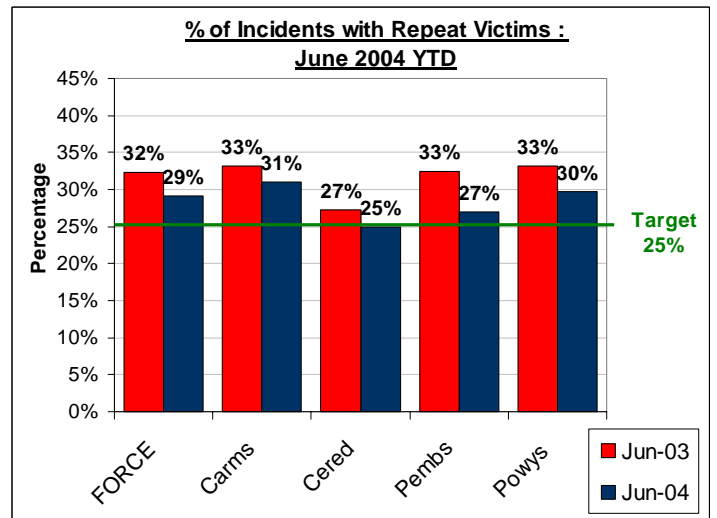
Total Repeat Domestic Incidents: June 2004 YTD

Among the total incidents recorded 29% involved persons who have been a victim at some other point during the preceding 12-months (approx 278 incidents).

This is a little lower than the approximate number during the same period last year (around 32% of total incidents). The volume of repeat victims has also fallen marginally – down by 3% in contrast to the 8% increase in total incidents.

Performance at divisional level remains characteristically lowest in Ceredigion at 25% repeat victims (approx 27% for the same period last year) while levels in Carmarthenshire and Powys both reduced.

Pembrokeshire is particularly notable in recording a reduction from 33% to 27% of incidents involving repeat victims.

Child Referrals – June 2004 YTD

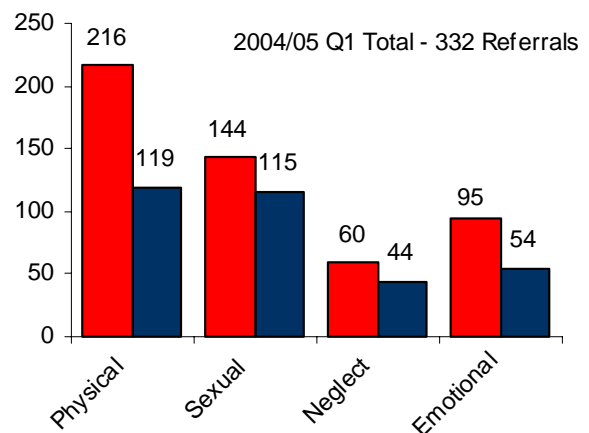
The total numbers of child referrals for April - June 2004 stands at 332, a 36% reduction on the previous year (although current data is provisional pending data from Carmarthenshire).

The majority of these referrals (71%) were for the protection of the child due to a perceived physical or sexual risk.

The number of victims interviewed on video currently stands at 53 – a level 38% lower than the same period last year (down to 53 from 86 interviews).

The numbers of children detained for protection (under s. 46) stands at 55 - a reduction of 24% on the previous year.

Adult Referrals & ABE - June 2004 YTD

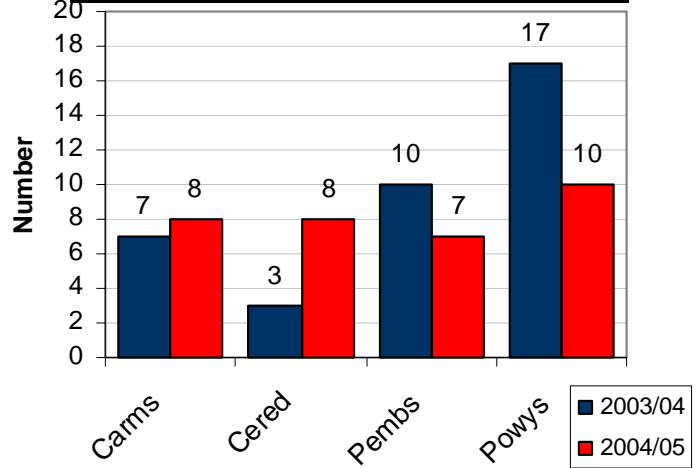
Levels of adult referral remain lower, recording a total of 51 for the year to date – up from 37 for the same period last year.

Physical threat remains the most common reason for adult referral – at 45% (broadly unchanged from last year).

The numbers of witness interviews (consistent with Achieving Best Evidence) recorded on video are recording a substantial increase.

Adult witness video interviews have increased marginally from 8 to 10, but child witness video interviews have increased to 77 from 40 for the same period last year.

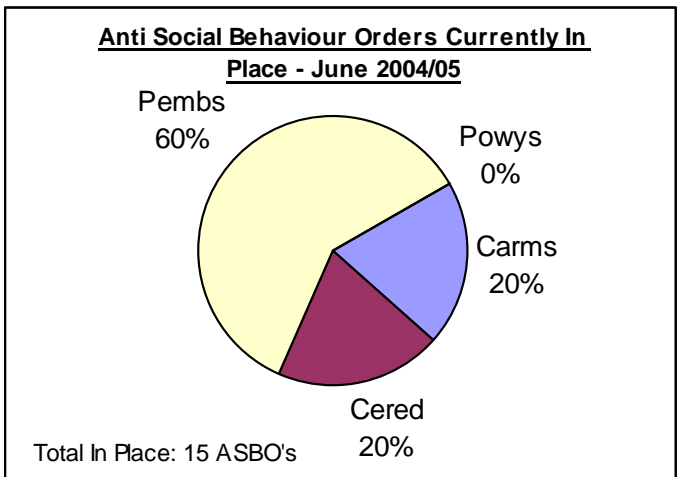
Anti-Social Behaviour Orders –June 2004 YTD

For the purposes of obtaining an ASBO the definition of anti-social behaviour requires that the defendant must be shown to have behaved in an anti-social manner and that an order is necessary for the protection of persons from further anti-social behaviour by the defendant.

There are currently a total of 15 individuals who currently have an ASBO in the force area – 9 in Pembrokeshire, 3 each in Carmarthenshire and Ceredigion and none so far recorded in Powys (latest PNC data July 2004).

Of these ASBO's – 11 were due to drunkenness in a public place and of the total 4 have subsequently been convicted of breaching their order.

Please note the ASBO is not currently a record of relative anti-social behaviour across the force – but rather of the relative desire to apply this specific measure to combat it.

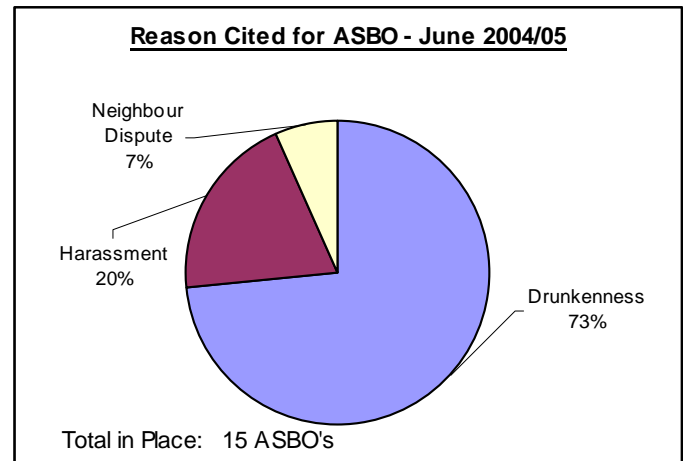


Public Disorder – Fixed Ticket Penalties

The recent introduction of fixed penalties for public disorder has seen only three being issued during the first months of operation – 2 in Carmarthenshire and 1 in Pembrokeshire all during June 2004.

This section will contain further analysis on the distribution of these as the data becomes available.

In addition, over the coming months (and as Anti-Social Behaviour Co-ordinators are introduced within all the local authorities) we shall be presenting additional data – including Anti-Social Behaviour Contracts (ABC's).

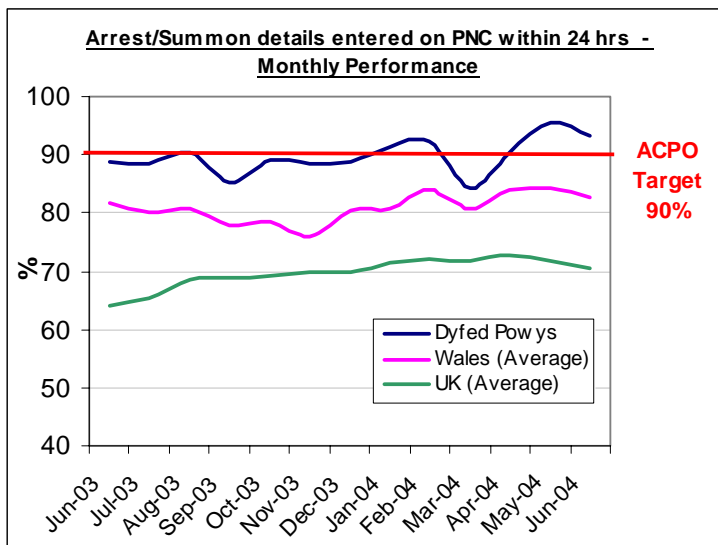
Arrest/Summons Details on PNC - Monthly

The speed at which details of arrest and summons in Dyfed Powys are entered on PNC is averaging about 89% within 24 hrs during the last 12-months ending June 2004.

The monthly figure for June 2004 was at 93%, consolidating the 95% and 90% recorded during the previous two months.

This remains higher than the Welsh and UK monthly average (83% and 70% respectively). Monthly performance has remained above the desired ACPO target of 90%.

The number of reports entered stands at a total of 2,659 for April-June 2004 – a reduction of 12% on the same period last year. This compares with an 8% increase in Wales and 12% increase across the UK.



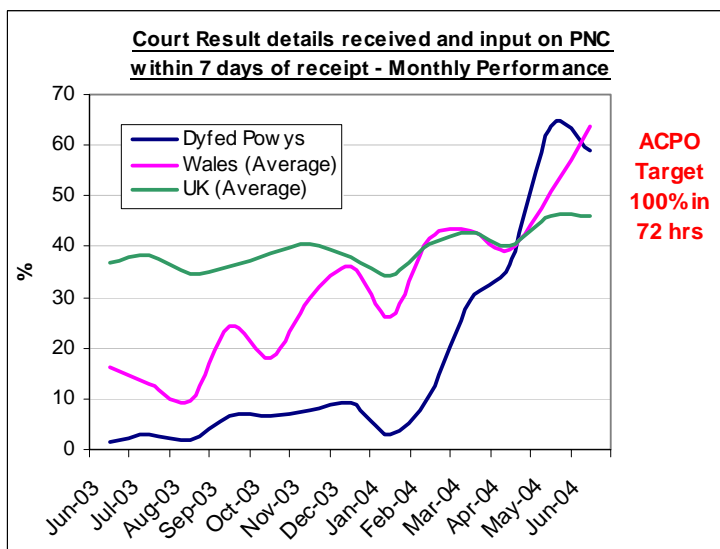
Court Result Details on PNC - Monthly

The monthly performance dipped a little during June 2004 – but consolidated the increase in the levels of performance recorded during the preceding six months. June 2004 monthly performance remains above the UK average and consistent with the Welsh average.

Monthly force performance for % of court results entered within 7-days of receipt rose to 29% in March, 36% in April, 64% in May 2004 and stood at 59% during the month of June 2004.

The Welsh and UK average for this month stand at 64% and 46% respectively. Average monthly performance for the 12-month period ending June 04 now stands at 20%.

The number of reports entered stands at 2,317 for April - June 2004 – a 9% increase on the same period last year. This compares with a 29% increase in Wales and 12% increase across the UK.

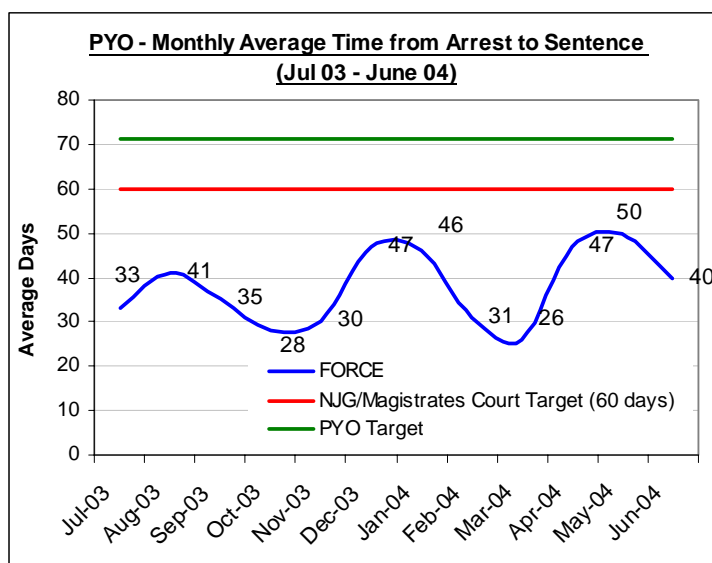
Persistent Young Offenders – June 2004

This section is aimed at providing performance information relating to the 'Narrowing the Justice Gap' (NJG) agenda and the number of offences brought to justice.

Monthly performance in June 2004 was an average period of 40 days from arrest of persistent young offender to time of sentence. This is an improvement on performance from the previous month.

This remains comfortably within the target for the local criminal justice board of 60 days – as it has for a number of months.

Monthly performance varies across the Magistrates Courts – from 8 days in North Pembrokeshire to an average of 71 days in Carmarthen and Aberystwyth. In Brecon the recorded monthly average has improved from 85 to 42 days completion in June 2004.



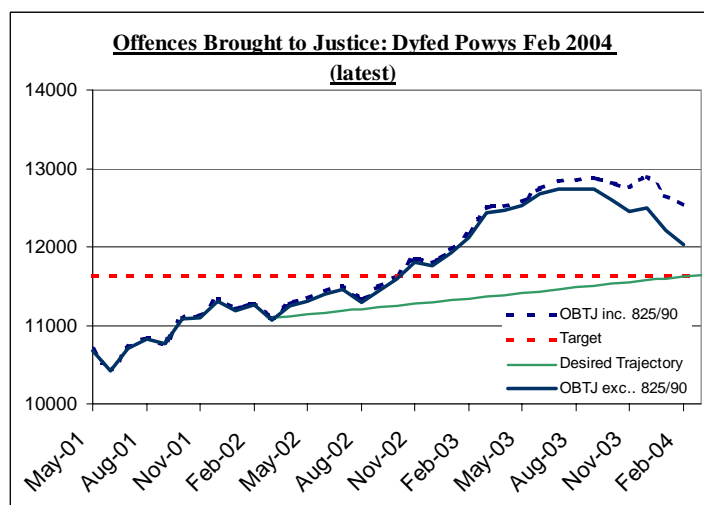
Offences Brought to Justice & NJG Performance

In 2001/02 a total of 11,068 offences were brought to justice (OBTJ), representing an attrition rate of 46.2% on the 24,003 recorded offences. In 2002/03 some 12,481 offences were brought to justice, giving a 49.7% attrition rate on the 25,104 recorded offences.

The figure for March 2003 - February 2004 (the most recently available 12-months' data) illustrates an 8.7% year-on-year increase in the number of offences BTJ compared to the baseline year (to currently stand at 12,028 offences), against a target of a 5% increase.

This represents an approximate attrition rate for the period of 39.1% on the 30,758 offences recorded during that 12-month period. Whilst the number of offences brought to justice is up, the rise in total recorded crime is higher which has resulted in a reduced attrition rate, and reflects a fall in detection volumes.

The Powys key figure for confidence in bringing offenders to justice for the year to September 2003 **47 %**. The national average for the same period is **40%**.

APPROX. IMPACT ON CURRENT PERFORMANCE OF IMPLEMENTING THE NATIONAL CRIME RECORDING STANDARD

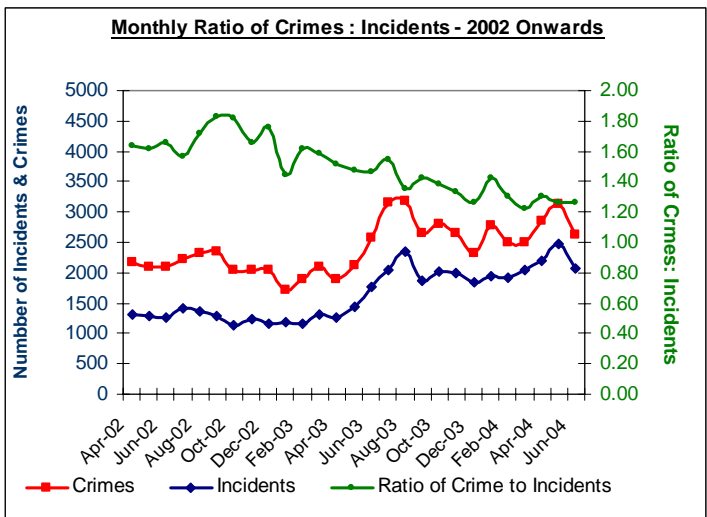

The Impact of NCRS - Methodology

As previously noted, it is evident that patterns of both crimes and incidents have been influenced by recent recording changes. Monthly levels of both have increased substantially since during the summer of 2003, and subsequently the ratio of crimes to incidents has fallen a little during the last six months.

We have calculated an average and maximum level of crimes to be expected in 2004/05 if NCRS was not present - based on performance during the 36 months prior to April 2003 (namely all the months of 2000/01, 2001/02 and 2002/03).

This provides an approximate range that we can say with some degree of probability that illustrates what crime levels in 2004/05 would be without NCRS. Based on historical trends, crime numbers above these figures are assumed as attributable to NCRS.



Current Crime Levels with NCRS impact removed

Recorded crime during April – June 2004 stands at 8,611 crimes – up 44% on 2001/02 levels (i.e. pre-NCRS), up 35% on 2002/03 levels, and up 31% on 2003/04 levels.

The average monthly crime levels indicate that an average quarter a total of 5,998 crimes might have been expected without NCRS – equating to an average of 1,999 per month.

Similarly, a measure of the maximum likely crime levels records that in a particularly bad quarter (based on historical performance) a total of 7,068 crimes might be expected without the impact of NCRS – a monthly average of 2,356 offences.

Making the assumption that NCRS is responsible for the crimes recorded above these totals provides an approximate range of impact. Consequently NCRS is estimated as being attributable for a range between a minimum of 18% and 30% of total current crime during 2004/05. It is notable that this has fallen during the last month as NCRS effects begin to stabilise.

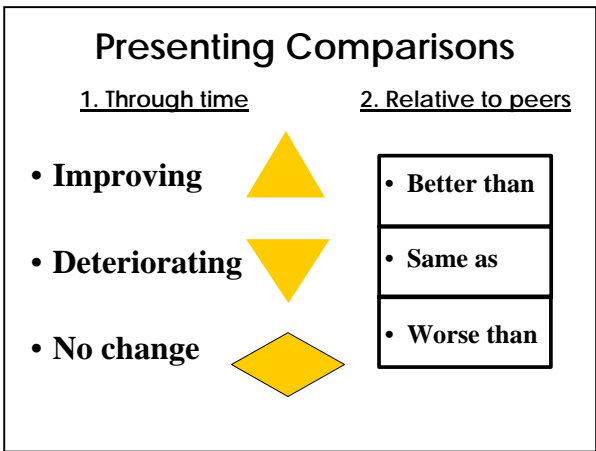
Presenting Performance Comparisons

The method outlined here represents a measure of improving or deteriorating performance – combined with a measure of peer comparison.

Simple arrow directions indicate improving and deteriorating performance, and a series of boxes illustrate performance relative to peers (most similar forces and BCU's).

If performance remains above its peers then the top box is used as an indicator, with the middle and lower boxes used to symbolise performance the same as or worse than peers respectively.

Also, if performance is both better than peers and improving over time it is also coloured green. Correspondingly if performance is worse than peers and deteriorating over time it is coloured red.
