CRIME TRENDS UPDATE July 2004

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Headline Statistics

DYFED-POWYS POLICE

July 2004

Recorded Crime:

- Total Recorded Crime is up by **19%** (+1,853 crimes) compared to the same period last year (SPLY) to stand at **11,603** crimes (23.8 per 1,000 population). The monthly figure for July 2004 indicates that the effects of NCRS on increasing levels of recorded offences has stabilised. Monthly crimes for July 2004 (2,992) are down by 5.7% on the same month in 2003 – the first valid comparison of post NCRS performance.
- Recorded detection performance remains down, with the detection rate for the force at **39%** (4,533 detections) – with the volume decreasing by **8%** (-412 detections). This remains below the detection target of 50%.

Domestic Burglary:

- Domestic Burglaries are up by 67 crimes or **23%** compared to the previous year to stand at 360, with a detection rate of **26%** (94 detections). This is a small decrease on the same period for the previous year (29%).
- The volume of detections has, however, increased by 9 (10%). Pembrokeshire currently has the highest detection rate, standing at **30%**. Crimes stood at 96 crimes (all domestic burglary offences) for the month of July 2004, a decrease of 2 crimes on the same month in 2003.

Violent Crimes:

- Total Violent Crime is up by **28%** (+719 crimes) to stand at 3,220 crimes and a detection rate of 58% (down by 9% on SPLY). Levels of Serious Violent Crime (section 18,20 & 47) have increased compared with the same period last year (+13%) to stand at 1,481 crimes.
- As in other offence categories, the levels of offences during the month of July 2004 only are down on the previous year. Violent crime in July 2004 was down by 7% on the same month in 2003 (from 855 to 798 offences).

Autocrime:

- Autocrime is up on the previous year (+**10%**/78 crimes) to stand at **816**, with increases recorded in Ceredigion (up 70%/+34 crimes) and Pembrokeshire (up 66%/84 crimes). These increases counter falling levels of autocrime in Powys (-9%/-8 crimes).
- Detection performance at **19%** (157 detections) is down on last year (34%) and below the 30% annual force target. In contrast to other categories the monthly number of offences saw a small increase in offences - recording 206 in the month of July 2004 – up 6% on July 2003 (194 offences).

Criminal Damage:

- Criminal Damage has recorded an increase of **47%** in April - July 2004 (+952 crimes) compared with the same period last year (April – July 2003) to stand at 2,977 crimes. In addition monthly offences for July 2004 stand at 727 offences, an increase of 12% on July 2003 (647 offences).
- The detection rate has decreased, against an increase in criminal damage offences, standing at **25%** (745 detections), compared with 32% for the previous year.

Drug Offences:

- Total Drug trafficking offences are down by **34%** compared with last year (down 32 offences to 57). Possession of Drug offences (including cannabis) is down **21%** for April - July 2004 compared with last year. Possessions are down by 42% in Powys and up by 13% in Ceredigion.
- The number of offenders dealt with for trafficking class-A drugs stands at **47** (up from 35 for the same period last year) with 2 cocaine offenders (falling from 5 SPLY), and Heroin offenders standing at 23 (up from 19 for the period April – July 2003). The instances of drug seizure are down **34%** (-352 seizures) on last year, with a total for April – July 2004 of 694 seizures.

Total Recorded Crime

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Local Target 2004/05 – 3% reduction. CDRP Target – a 27% reduction (23,043 crimes) to attain CDRP target. 50% detection rate

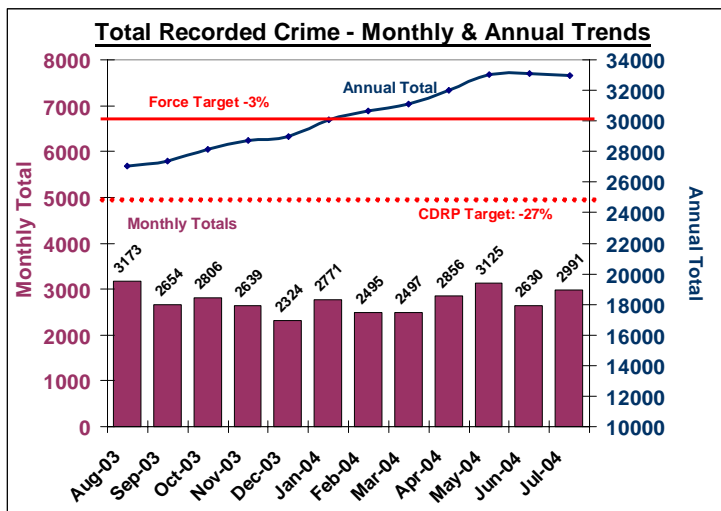
Recorded Crime - Annual Trends

Total recorded crime for April – July 2004 stands at 11,603 offences – a figure that is 19% (+1,853 crimes) higher than the same period last year.

All the divisions recorded substantial increases - the smallest in Powys (+19.7%), with greater increases still being recorded in Ceredigion (+22%), Pembrokeshire (+25%), and Carmarthenshire (+27%).

The monthly figure for July 2004 indicates that the effects of NCRS on increasing levels of recorded offences has stabilised. Monthly crimes for July 2004 (2,992) are down by 5.7% on the same month in 2003.

In Powys and Ceredigion the monthly total for July 2004 are also down on the previous year (monthly crimes down by –15% and –4% respectively).



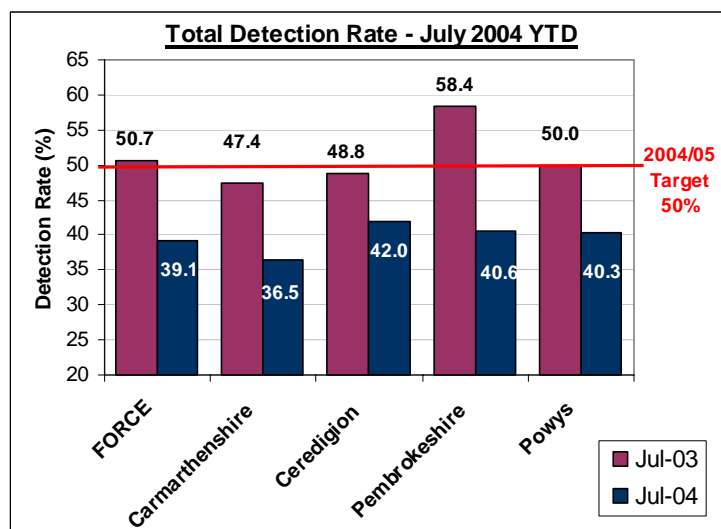
Detection Performance 2004/05

The current overall detection rate for 2004-05 is 39% - a notable decrease on the 50.7% recorded for the same period last year.

The volume of crimes detected is currently below the previous year – having decreased by 11.7% (-412 detections) to stand at 4,533 detections during April - July 2004.

As in previous months this reflects the general increase in crime levels, compounded by the fact that many of these additional crimes recorded can be far more difficult to detect.

The divisions continue to show a slight variation in performance, with all illustrating a similar scale of fall in detection rate. Powys and Ceredigion currently record the highest rate at 47% and 44% respectively.

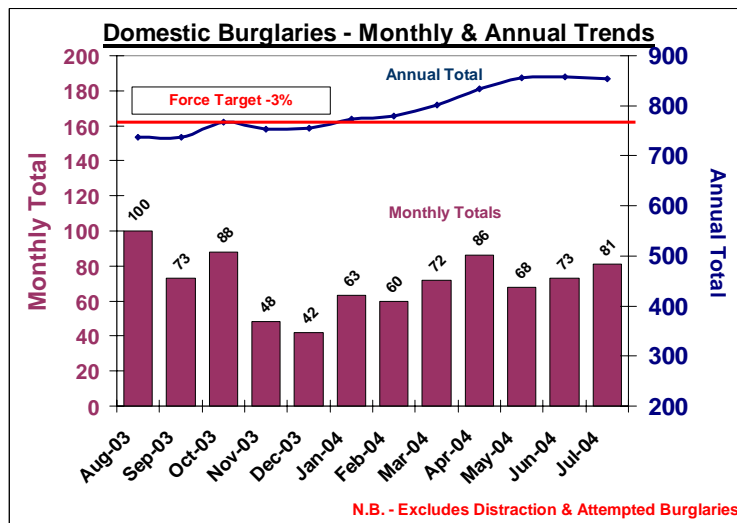
Recorded Crime - Annual Trends

The total recorded domestic burglaries for 2004-05 currently stands at 360 crimes, an increase of 23% (+67 crimes) compared to the same period last year.

As in previous months the variation in divisional performance remains – with Pembrokeshire recording a 40% increase (+21 crimes) in contrast to the increase of 8% (+1 crime) recorded in Ceredigion.

The monthly figures for July 2004 again illustrate a stable level of performance – in contrast to recent months.

Crimes stood at 96 crimes (all domestic burglary offences) for the month of July 2004, a decrease of 2 crimes on the same month in 2003.

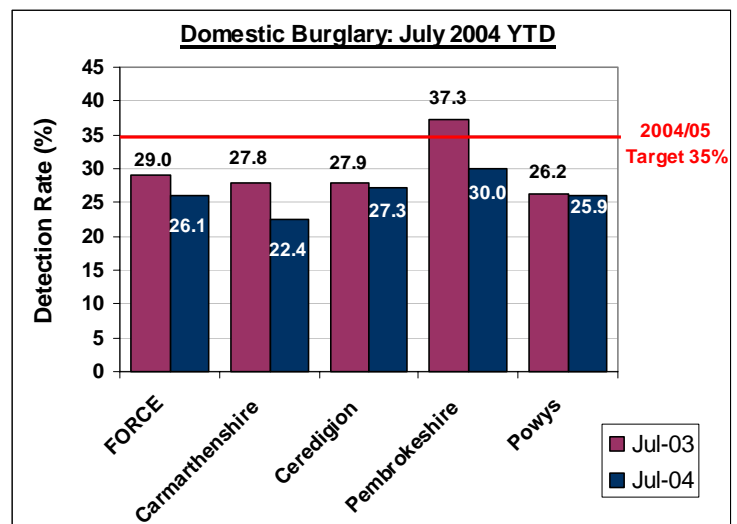


Detection Performance 2004/05

A detection rate of 26% is currently being recorded for the period April-July 2004, compared with 29% for the previous year. It is worth noting that the monthly detection performance for July stands at 28% compared with 31% for July 2003.

The volume of detections reflects the increase of offences - up by 9 detections to stand at 94 detections for the period.

Among the divisions, Powys (29.6%) is notable in continuing to show an improved performance compared with the previous year. However, it is Pembrokeshire (30%) that is the highest performing division – although below the target of 35%.



Distraction Burglaries 2004/05

Recorded levels of distraction burglaries stand at 4 crimes (one detected) for the period April – July 2004, which is one fewer than during the same period last year. These offences were committed in Carmarthenshire (2) and Powys (2).

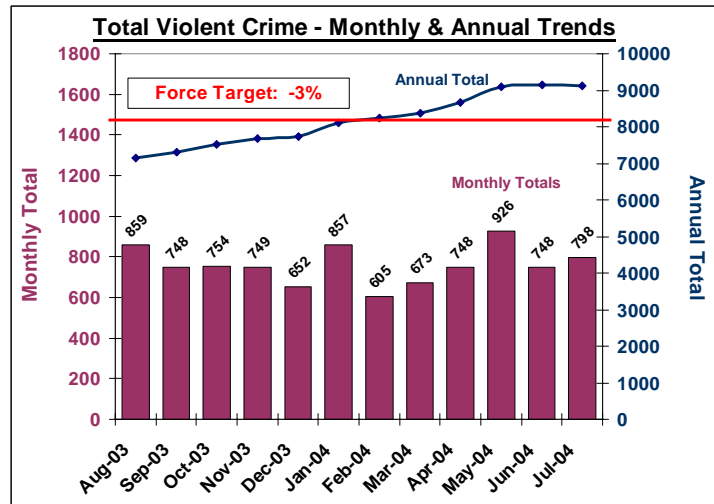
Total Violent Crime - Annual Trends

Total crimes for 2004–05 year-to-date (April-July) stand at 3,220 offences, an increase of 719 offences (+28%) compared with this time the previous year (April – July 2003).

Rates of increase vary across the divisions, with a relatively large rise in Carmarthenshire of 46% (up 401 crimes) compared with an increase of only 2% in Ceredigion (up by 9 offences).

The number of sexual offences is recorded as 190 crimes for the period Apr-July - an increase of 45 offences (+31%) on the same period last year. Robberies stand at 13 offences – down 3 (-30%).

As in other offence categories, the monthly levels of offences during July 2004 are down on the previous year. Violent crime in July 2004 was down by 7% on the same month in 2003 (from 855 to 798 offences).



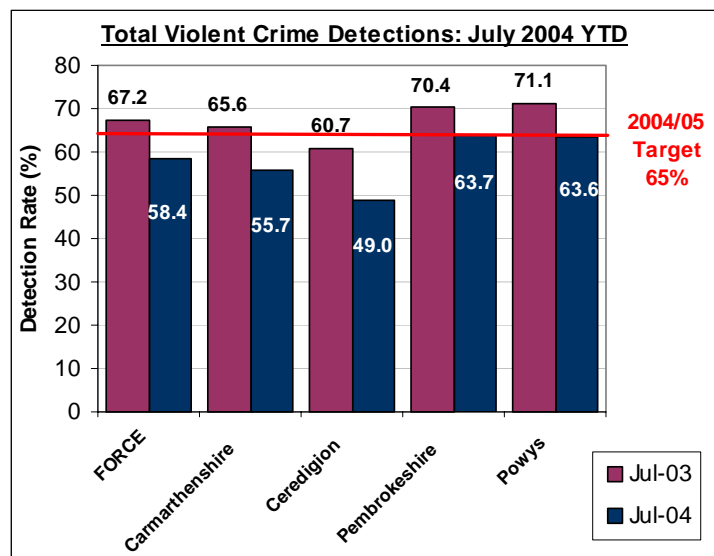
Detection Performance 2004/05 (April - July)

The detection performance stands at 58% for 2004-05. This is a reduction on the on the 67% recorded for the same period last year and below the established target of 65%.

The volume of detections is up by 12% (+202 detections) compared with the previous year to stand at 1,882 detected violent crimes.

All divisions have recorded a reduction in recorded detection performance. For example Carmarthenshire records the largest reduction with detection falling from 64% to 43% - against a background of the smallest increase in offences. Pembrokeshire recorded a 5% decrease in detections.

Both, Ceredigion and Powys recorded an increase in detection by 6% and 9% respectively.

Serious Violent Crime

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Local Target – 3% reduction in total violent crime & 65% Detection Rate

Serious Violent Crime – Sections 18, 20 & 47

This category includes assault and wounding offences covered by sections 18, 20 and 47, but excludes the crime category 105A (common assaults) Total for the period April - July 2004 stands at 1,481 offences, an increase of +13% (+168 offences) on those recorded in the previous year.

Carmarthenshire recorded offences up by 29% on the same period last year and Pembrokeshire up by 19%. In contrast Ceredigion saw a notable reduction in offences – down by 11% compared with the previous year.

The numbers of offences during the month of July 2004 stand at 400 – an 8% reduction on the same month in 2003 (436 offences).

This is an indication that medium term trends in offences are stabilising after a period of steady increases. However, recording changes mean some caution is needed when interpreting performance.

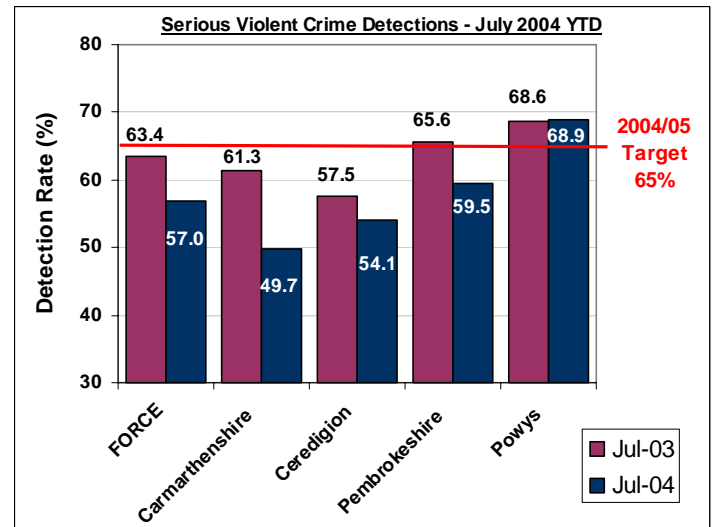
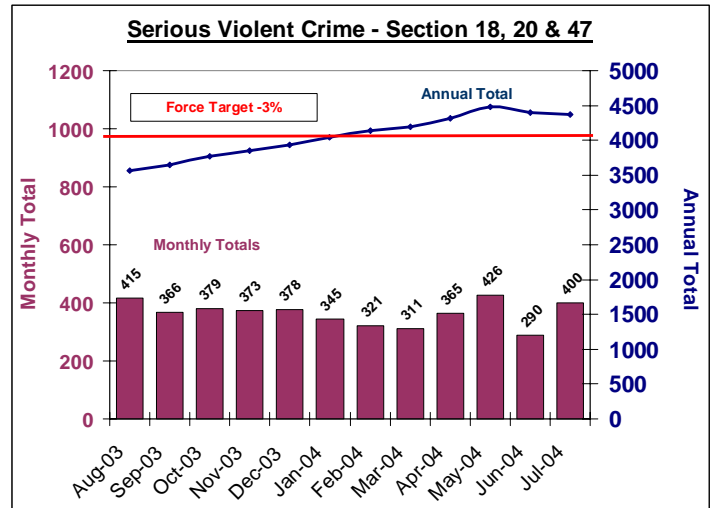
Detection Performance 2004/05 - July 2004 YTD

The period April – July 2004 records a detection rate of 57% for serious violent crime, compared to 63% achieved during the same period last year.

This fall in apparent detection performance is set against a marginal increase in the number of detections recorded – up to by 1% to stand at 844 for the period.

Carmarthenshire is notable in that it continues to record a notable increase in offences (+29%) combined with a fall in detection rate (-12%), but the recorded volume of detections has remained largely unchanged at 286 detections. A similar pattern is exhibited in Pembrokeshire.

Detection rates for serious violent crimes remain characteristically lower than those for total violent crime across the divisions.

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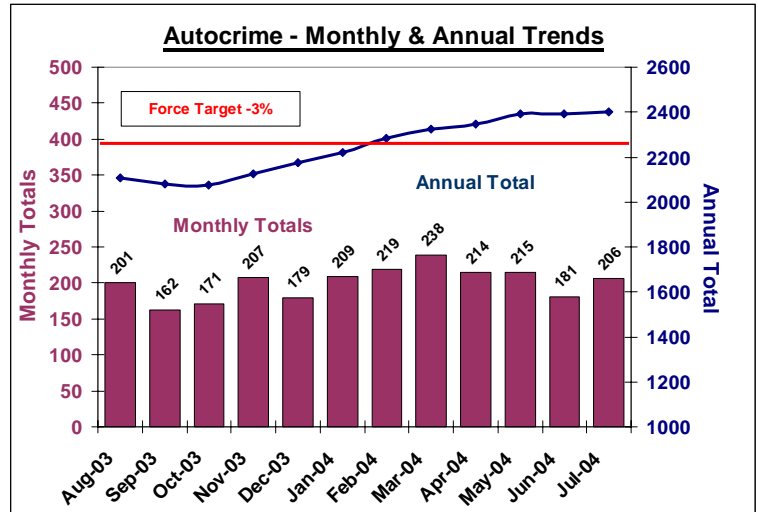

Autocrime - Annual Trends

Total offences stand at 816 for the period April - July 2004, an increase of 10% (+78 offences) on the previous year.

Ceredigion and Pembrokeshire are currently recording notable increases - with offences up 70% and 66% respectively. In contrast Powys and Carmarthenshire recorded a reduction of 9% and 5% respectively compared with the same period last year.

However, the monthly number of offences saw a small apparent increase in offences - recording 206 in the month of July 2004 – up 6% on July 2003 (194 offences).



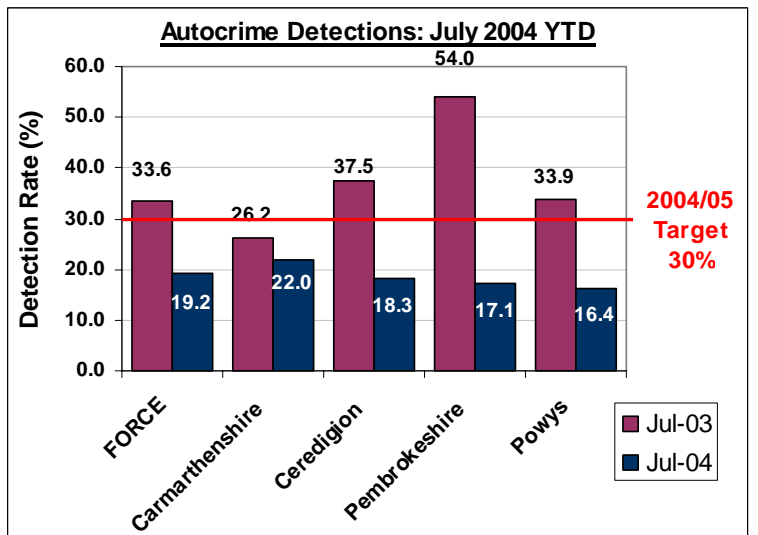
Detection Performance 2004/05

Detection performance stands at 19% for April - July 2004. This is below the target of 30% and a decrease on the 34% recorded for the same period last year.

Compounding this, the volume of detections recorded has also fallen by half over the period (-37% or 91 detections).

Recorded performance across the force is recording substantial reductions in detection rate – with Powys seeing rates fall from 54% last year to 17% for the period April-July 2004.

Powys is notable in recording a reduction in the detection rate from 34% (62 detections) last year to 16% (27 detections) this year.

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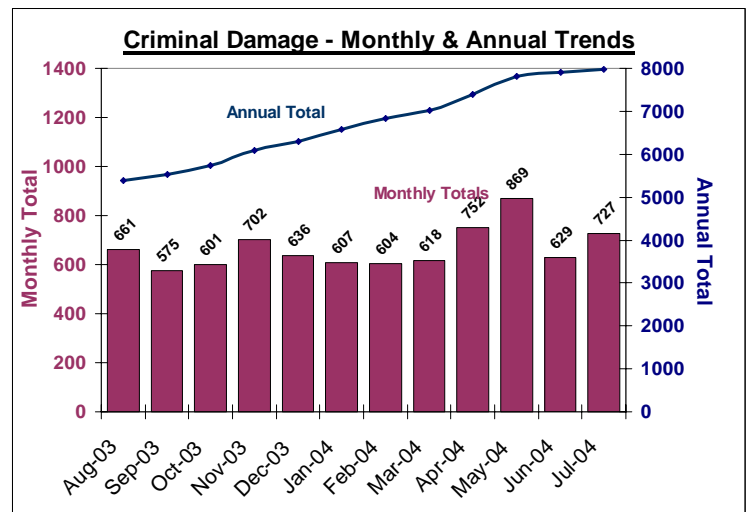
April – July 2004

Criminal Damage - Annual Trends

A total 2,977 offences were recorded in April – July 2004, an increase of 47% in criminal damage offences (+952 offences) compared with last year.

Increases in recorded totals remain evident across the force area, up 49% in Carmarthenshire and 55% in Powys, supplemented by increases of 53% in Pembrokeshire and 17% in Ceredigion.

In addition monthly offences for July 2004 stand at 727 offences, an increase of 12% on the same month in 2003 (647 offences).



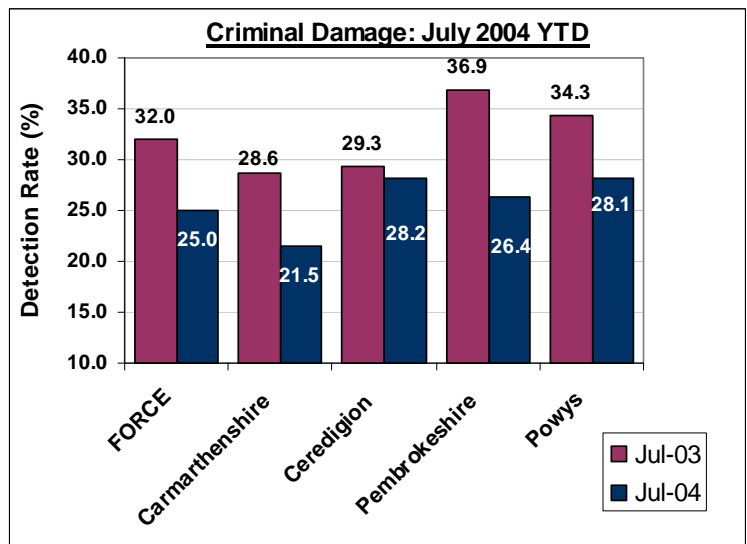
Detection Performance 2004/05

The detection rate has fallen from the previous year – standing at 25% for April - July 2004 compared with 32% for the same period last year.

Reflecting the increase in offences, the volume of detections has correspondingly risen by 15% this year (97 more detections) to stand at 745 detections for the period April – July 2004.

Pembrokeshire and Powys recorded almost identical reductions in recorded detection performance – both down from 26% to 28% respectively. Ceredigion is notable recording no notable difference in detection performance – down from 29% to 28%.

As mentioned previously, increasing crime levels are compounded by the nature of the additional crimes being recorded that in many instances make them more difficult to detect.

Scientific Support Unit (SSU)

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Reporting Only

Scientific Support Unit (SSU) Function

The unit assists the collation and preservation of fingerprint, photographic and other forensic evidence. The recovery of fingerprints from the crime scene is performed by one of the 12 Scientific Support Officers (SSO) or by a designated Scene Examiner (SE).

Following arrival at the unit the material is checked and recorded at the administration section and from here is distributed to the appropriate section within the unit.

Items handled at the scene will be examined in the Fingerprint Development Unit by one of two trained staff. Finally the photographed marks will be transferred to our Fingerprint Bureau where three experts work independently on these images to provide identification in accordance with Nationally Approved Standards.

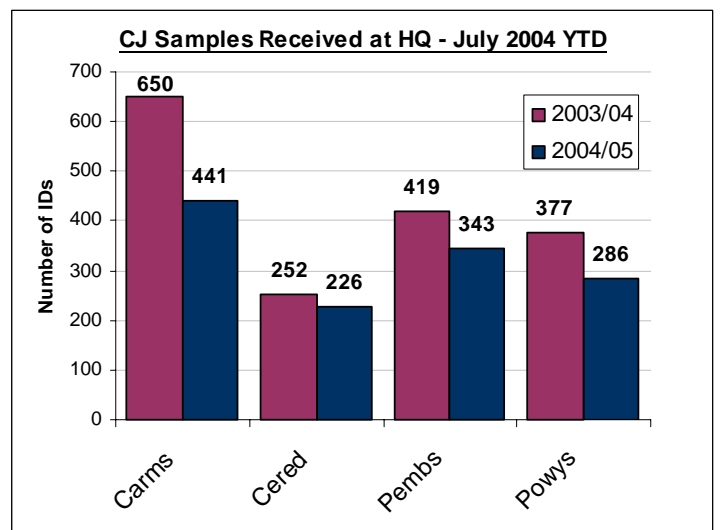
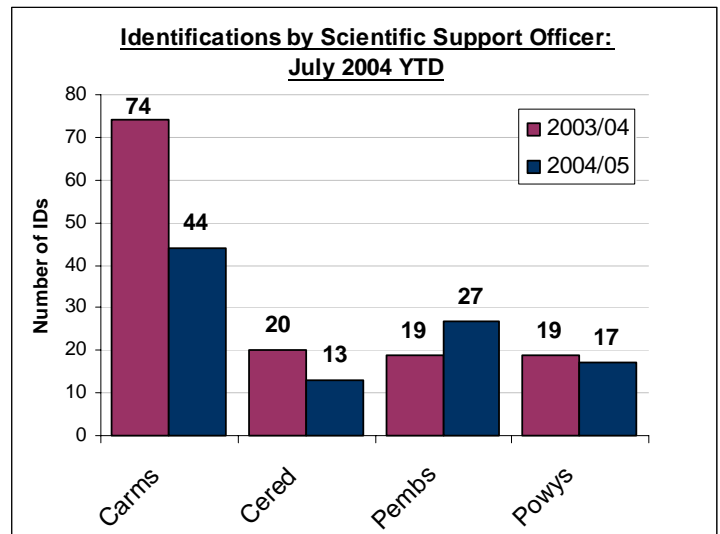
Performance for 2004-05

The number of identifications for the period April-July 2004 stand at 128, a fall of 37% on the same period last year. Scientific Support Officers (SSO) completed 79%, - this compares with 71% SSO ID's last year.

The total number of fingerprint development unit identifications conducted (FDU) stands at 67 for the year-to-date - this represents 52% of the total number of ID's (compared with 57% last year).

The total number of DNA matches is down slightly from 166 to 154 (down 7%) with the number of out-of-force matches at 120 (down 9% on the previous year). In addition 275 forensic submissions have been made - up by 9% on the previous year.

A total of 1296 CJ samples have been received at HQ - of which 94% (1,220) have been sent to a laboratory for further tests. This compares with 88% for the same period last year. Numbers of samples rejected have reduced from 13 to 2. It is worth re-iterating that a number of individuals can be involved with these processes.

Drug Statistics Update

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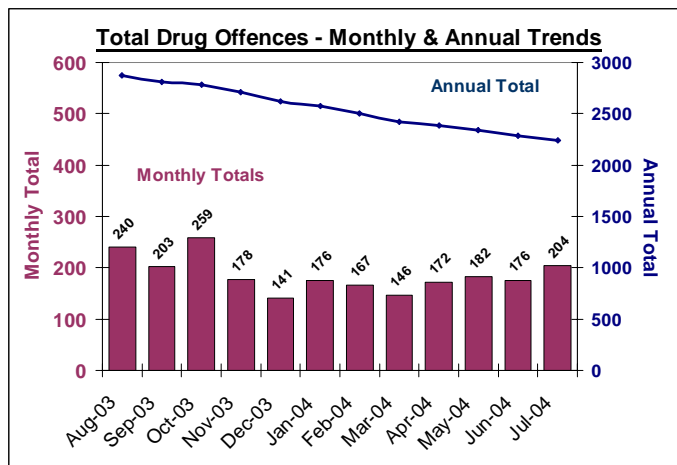
April – July 2004

All Drug Offences

The number of total drug offences for April - July 2004 stand at a total of 734 – a decrease of 11% (-135 crimes) on the same period last year.

Performance at divisional level continues to show sharp variation with decreases of 11% in Pembrokeshire and 25% in Carmarthenshire. A much larger 38% fall is recorded in Powys, which continues to contrast with a 15% increase in Ceredigion.

Trafficking offences have fallen by 34% over the period, with possession offences now subject to changes in recorded performance arising from the reclassification of cannabis. Total possessions (including cannabis) are down 21% on the previous year at 645 offences.



Drug Trafficking & Possession (2004 YTD)

- The current level of 'Trafficking in Controlled Drugs' (HO Class 92A) **offences** stands at **57** for the period April – July 2004, a fall of **34%** (-32 offences) on the same period last year.
- 'Possession of Cannabis' and 'Other Drug Possession' (classification 92D and 92E) have fallen collectively by **21.4%**, with **645** recorded during April – July 2004, a decrease of **176** offences. As reported in previous months, collective drug/Cannabis possession offences in Powys are down by a notable **42%** - compared to a rise of **13%** in Ceredigion.
- **Class A drugs (April – July 2004):**
 - The **57** trafficking offences recorded during April - July 2004, relate to **52** individual offenders (there are more offences than offenders since they may be jointly charged for the same offence). There were a total of **47** offenders charged for trafficking Class-A drugs, and increase of **12** offenders on the **35** recorded for the same period last year (+34%).
 - There have been **2** offenders dealt with for trafficking Cocaine (compared to 5 last year) while Heroin offenders charged now stands at **23**, (up from 19 last year). Ecstasy offenders currently stand at **16** – up from 8 the previous year.

Drug Seizures

- The fall in the instances where drugs are seized reported during recent months has continued with a 34% reduction in April – July 2004 compared with the previous year. This is a little lower than the 36% annual reduction reported last month. It is worth continuing to note that while the frequency of individual seizures of Cannabis is down (-35%) the volume of drugs seized (i.e. Cannabis Resin up from 10 to 33 kg) has increased notably.

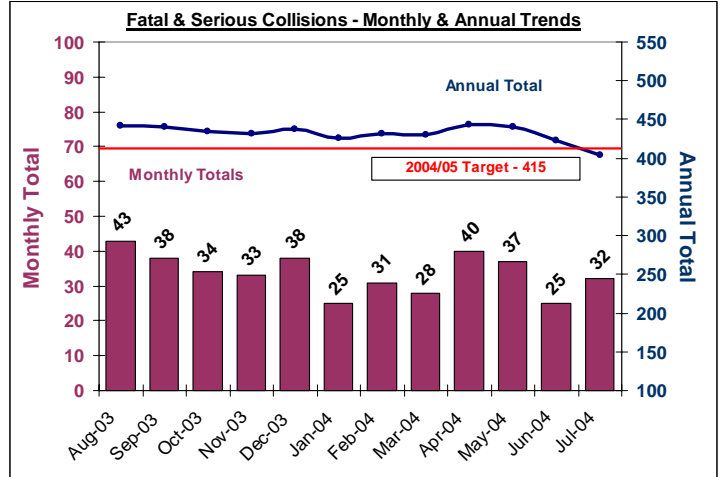
Serious and Fatal Collisions – Annual Trends

The total level of fatal collisions currently stands at 12 for April - July 2004, 3 fewer than the number recorded during the same period last year.

The total levels of serious and fatal collisions currently stand at 134 for April - July 2004, down by 16% on the previous year (160 collisions). This is consistent with the target for the period of 0.28 per 1,000 population or 138 collisions.

The year ending July 2004 is currently recording a provisional total of 404 serious and fatal collisions – a 9% fall on the preceding 12-month period.

Fatal and serious collisions have reduced by 26% in Powys and 19% in Carmarthenshire while recording no change in Pembrokeshire.



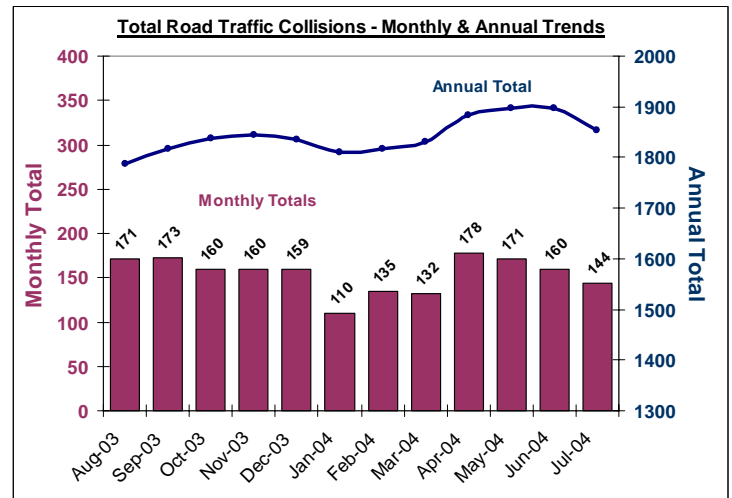
Total Road Traffic Collisions – Annual Trends

The total number of collisions (including slight) recorded during April - July 2004 stands at 653 – an increase of 4% or 24 collisions on the same period last year.

Total collisions are currently recording an increase across the force area, but particular in Powys and Pembrokeshire - where levels are up by 10% and 7% respectively. In contrast levels in Ceredigion fell by 4% over the same period.

Total collisions for the year ending July 2004 stand at 1,853 - an increase of 3% on the preceding 12-month period.

Medium term trends in total collision numbers have increased gradually over past months. This remains a concern, notwithstanding the fall in serious and fatal collisions.

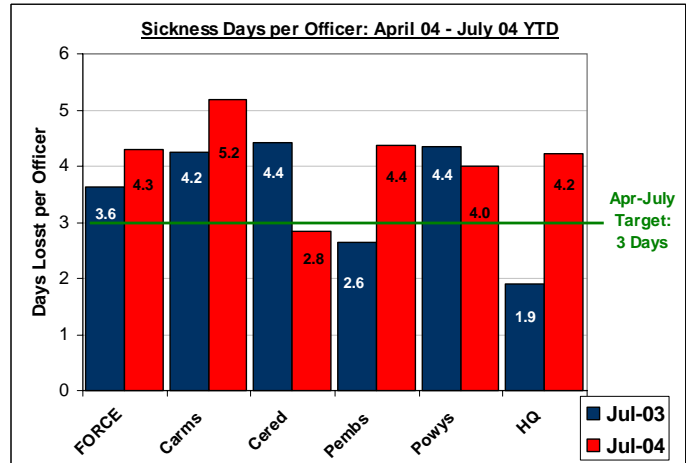
Officer Sickness Levels YTD

Sickness levels for the year stand at 4.3 days per officer (5052.5 days) representing an increase of 18% on the previous year. This is an increase of 846.5 total days compared with the previous year total (4206 days or 3.6 days per officer).

The force figure has exceeded the established target of 3 days for April – July 2004.

Among the divisions, Ceredigion has recorded a reduction in sickness from 4.4 days to 2.8 days per officer and a reduction of 34% in the total number of days. This is returning to levels closer to the 2002 level of sickness.

At the moment it is HQ that is recording the greatest increase, with sickness up to 4.2 days per officer (total days up by 119%).

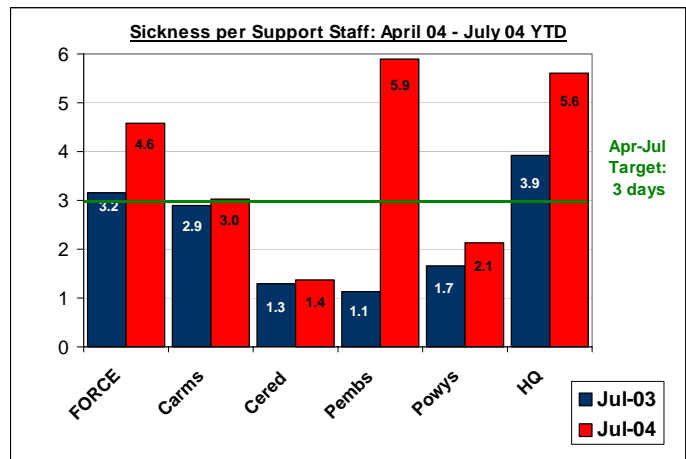


Police Staff Sickness Levels YTD

The level of recorded sickness stands at 4.6 days per police staff member for the period April – July 2004. This is also some way from the established target of 3 days per staff member for the period.

Similarly this is an increase on the 3.2 days recorded for the same period last year. The total number of sickness days recorded stands at 2,676 – up by 62% on the previous year. This also reflects a 12% increase in the average police staff strength.

The lowest current levels of police staff sickness stand at 1.4 days in Ceredigion and 2.1 in Powys. However Pembrokeshire recorded an increase of 449% in days (55 last year, and 302 this period).

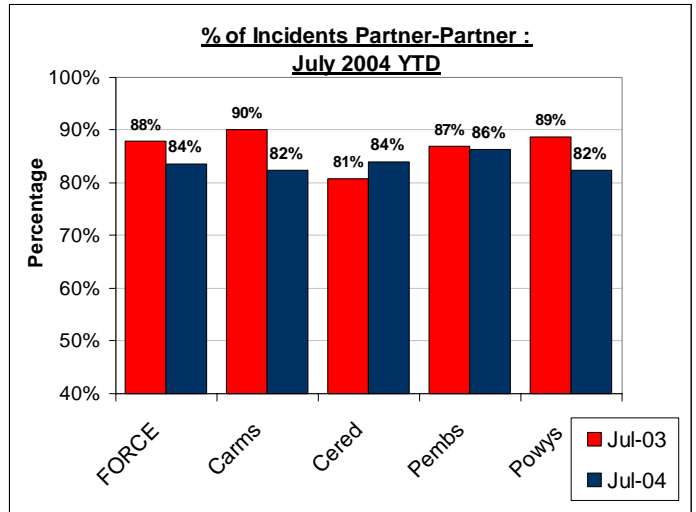
% Partner/Partner Incidents: July 2004 YTD

The total incidents recorded stands at 1,279 incidents for the period April-July 2004 – an 5% increase on the same period last year (+64 incidents).

In contrast the total level of arrests arising from these incidents has fallen by 10% to stand at 384 (compared with 427 last year). The % of arrests where a power of arrest occurs is stable at 80% (82% last year).

The proportion of incidents attributable to partner-partner (both current and former) conflict stands at 84% - a decrease on the 88% last year. In addition, the volume of partner related incidents is largely unchanged, having increased by 1 incident over the period.

Carmarthenshire and Powys continue to record notable reductions in the % of incidents that involve partners – both at 82% from 90% last year.



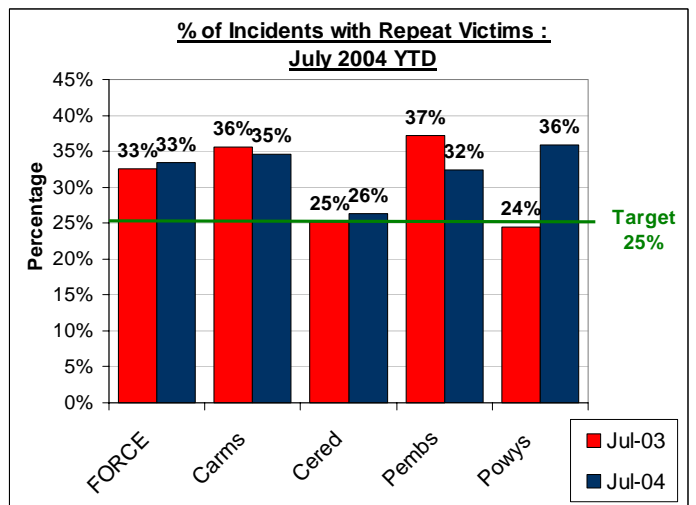
Total Repeat Domestic Incidents: July 2004 YTD

Among the total incidents recorded 33% involved persons who have been a victim at some other point during the preceding 12-months (approx 428 incidents).

This is a little lower than the approximate number during the same period last year (around 33% of total incidents).

Performance at divisional level remains characteristically lowest in Ceredigion at 26% repeat victims (approx 25% for the same period last year) while levels in Carmarthenshire and Powys both reduced.

Pembrokeshire is particularly notable in recording a reduction from 37% to 32% of incidents involving repeat victims.

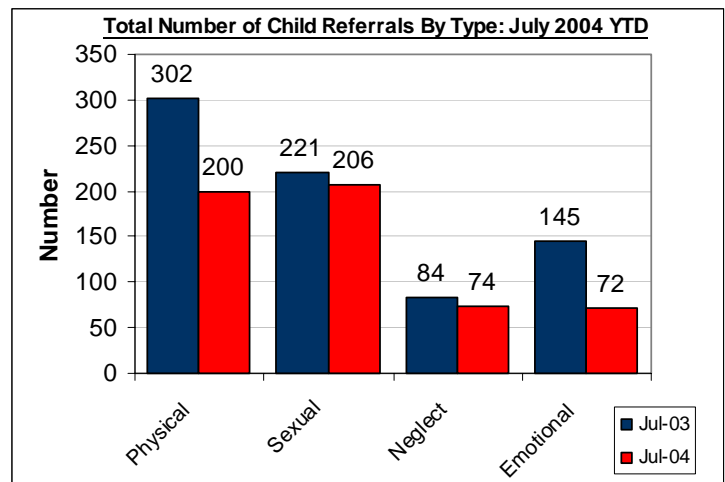
Child Referrals – July 2004 YTD

The total numbers of child referrals for April - July 2004 stands at 552, a 27% reduction on the previous year (although current data is provisional pending data from Carmarthenshire).

The majority of these referrals (74%) were for the protection of the child due to a perceived physical or sexual risk.

The number of victims interviewed on video currently stands at 110 – a level 12% lower than the same period last year (down to 110 from 125 interviews).

The numbers of children detained for protection (under s. 46) stands at 81 - a reduction of 35% on the previous year.



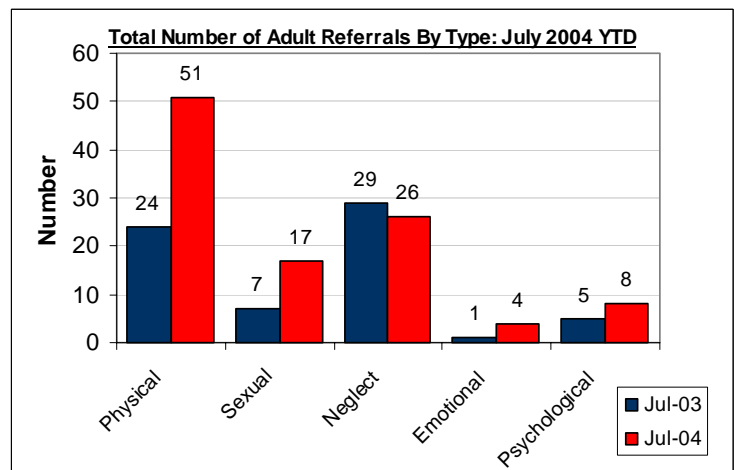
Adult Referrals & ABE - July 2004 YTD

Levels of adult referral remain lower, recording a total of 106 for the year to date – up from 66 for the same period last year.

Physical threat remains the most common reason for adult referral – at 48% (broadly unchanged from last year).

The numbers of witness interviews (consistent with Achieving Best Evidence) recorded on video are recording a substantial increase.

Adult witness video interviews have increased marginally from 14 to 35, but child witness video interviews have increased to 122 from 63 for the same period last year.

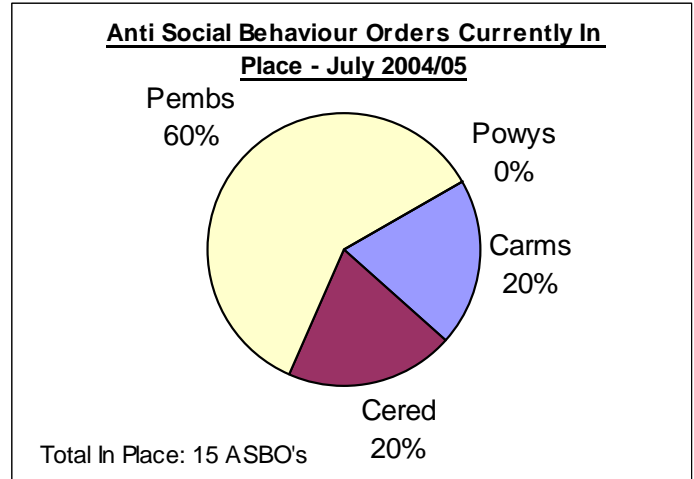
Anti-Social Behaviour Orders –July 2004 YTD

For the purposes of obtaining an ASBO the definition of anti-social behaviour requires that the defendant must be shown to have behaved in an anti-social manner and that an order is necessary for the protection of persons from further anti-social behaviour by the defendant.

There are currently a total of 15 individuals who currently have an ASBO in the force area – unchanged from last month.

Of these ASBO's – 11 were due to drunkenness in a public place and of the total 4 have subsequently been convicted of breaching their order.

Please note the ASBO is not currently a record of anti-social behaviour – but rather of the relative desire to apply this specific measure to combat it.

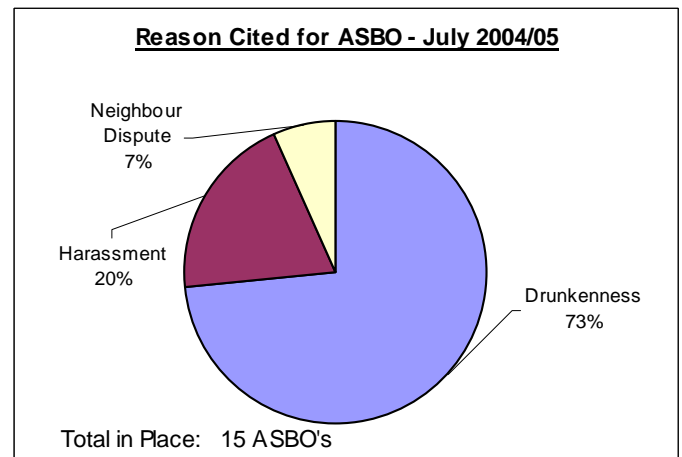


Public Disorder – Fixed Ticket Penalties

The recent introduction of fixed penalties for public disorder has seen 19 being issued during the first two months of operation – 10 in Carmarthenshire, 6 in Powys, 2 in Ceredigion and 1 in Pembrokeshire.

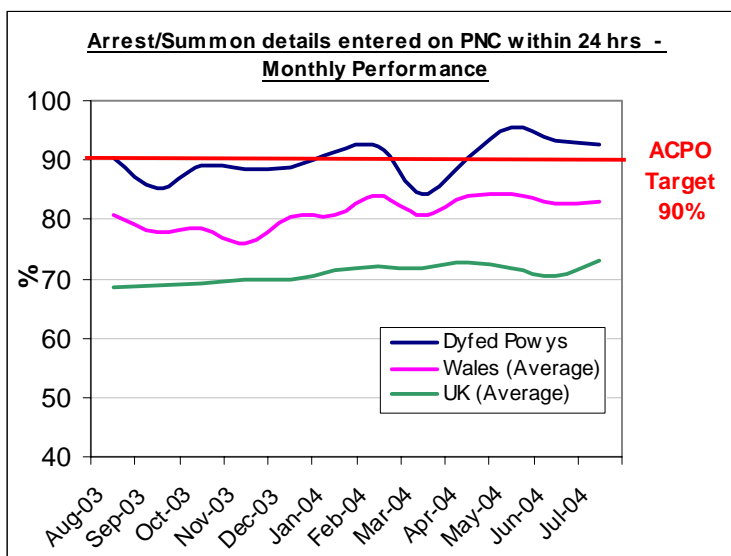
Arrest/Summons Details on PNC - Monthly

The speed at which details of arrest and summons in Dyfed Powys are entered on PNC is averaging about 93% within 24 hrs during the four months of 2004/05.

The monthly figure for July 2004 was at 93%, consolidating the 95% and 93% recorded during the preceding two months.

The monthly performance is also higher than the Welsh and UK monthly average (83% and 73% respectively) as it has been for some months. Monthly performance has remained above the desired ACPO target of 90%.

The number of reports entered stands at a total of 3,603 for April-July 2004 – a reduction of 15% on the same period last year. This compares with an 6% increase in Wales and 11% increase across the UK.



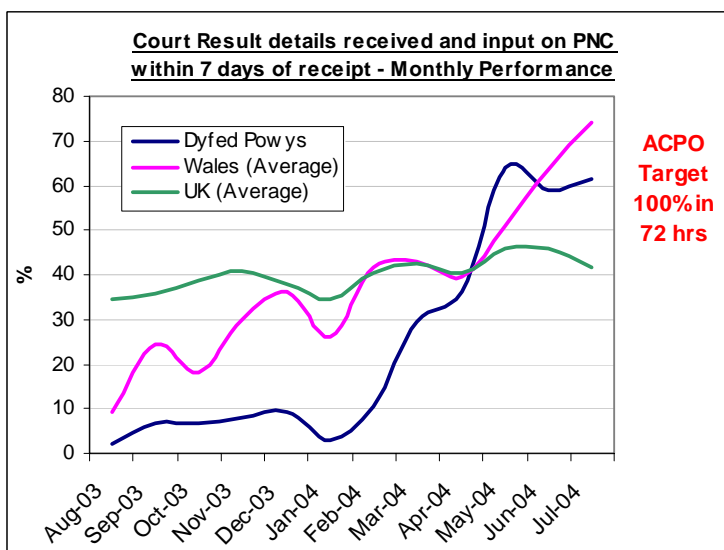
Court Result Details on PNC - Monthly

The monthly performance for July has increased a little on the previous month – up to 61% from 58% last month.

This remains above the UK average but below the Welsh forces average (42% and 74% respectively).

The sharp increase in monthly performance of court results entered on PNC within 7 days during March–May 2004 has since been consolidated to deliver monthly levels consistently around 60%.

The number of reports entered stands at 3,077 for April - July 2004 – a 9% increase on the same period last year. This compares with a 22% increase in Wales and 19% increase across the UK.

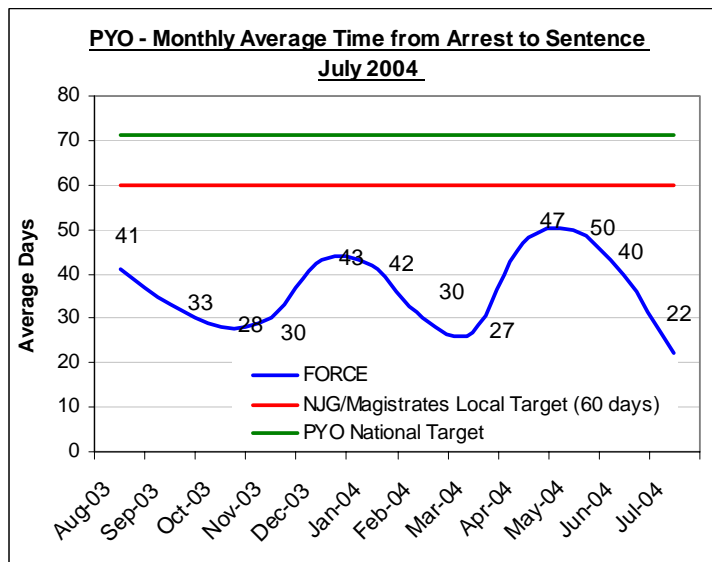
Persistent Young Offenders – July 2004

This section is aimed at providing performance information relating to the 'Narrowing the Justice Gap' (NJG) agenda and the number of offences brought to justice.

Monthly performance in July 2004 was an average period of 22 days from arrest of persistent young offender to time of sentence. This data remains provisional – and is likely to be revised upwards.

This remains comfortably within the target for the local criminal justice board of 60 days – as it has for a number of months – and well within the national target of 71 days.

Monthly performance (June 2004 latest) varies across the Magistrates Courts – from 8 days in North Pembrokeshire to an average of 71 days in Carmarthen and Aberystwyth. In Brecon the recorded monthly average has improved from 85 days the previous month to 42 days completion.



Offences Brought to Justice & NJG Performance

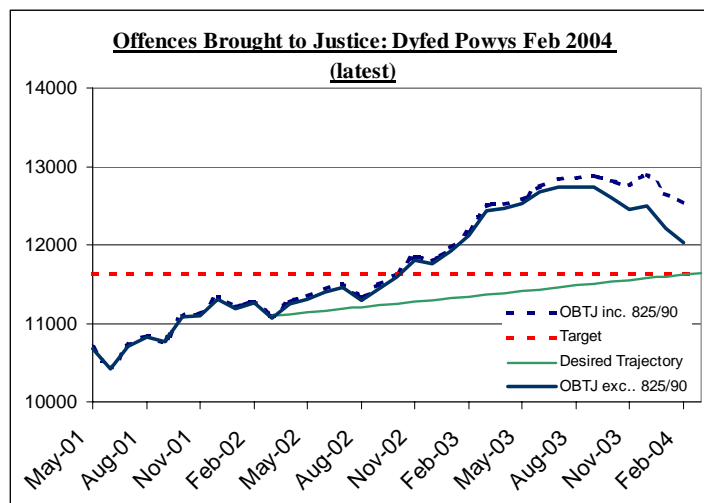
In 2001/02 a total of 11,068 offences were brought to justice (OBTJ), representing an attrition rate of 46.2%. In 2002/03 some 12,481 offences BTJ, giving a 49.7% attrition rate on the 25,104 offences recorded.

The figure for March 2003 - February 2004 (the most recently available 12-months' data) illustrates an 8.7% year-on-year increase in the number of offences BTJ compared to the baseline year (to currently stand at 12,028 offences), against a target of a 5% increase.

This represents an approximate attrition rate for the period of 39.1% on the 30,758 offences recorded during that 12-month period.

Other NJG performance measures are illustrating a monthly ineffective trial rate for crown courts at 8% for June 2004 (target 12%), and for magistrates courts at 18% (target 23%).

File quality targets are also being met. The force monthly figure for June 2004 stands at 95%, with year to date (Apr-Jun) at 90% - ahead of the established target of 85% for 2004/05.

APPROX. IMPACT ON CURRENT PERFORMANCE OF IMPLEMENTING THE NATIONAL CRIME RECORDING STANDARD

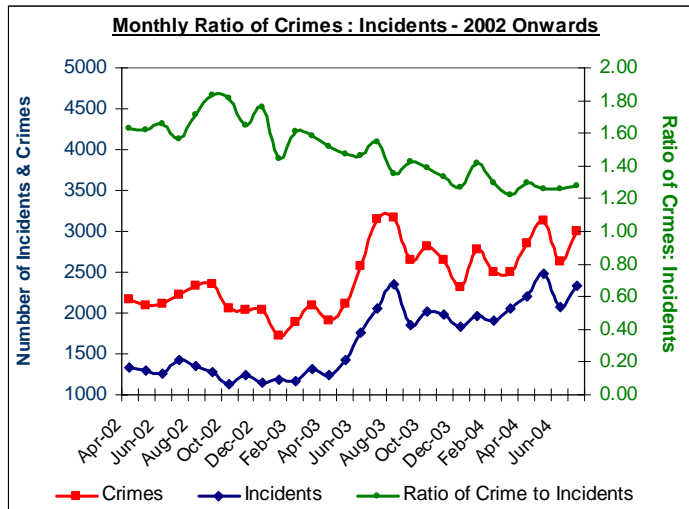

The Impact of NCRS - Methodology

As previously noted, it is evident that patterns of both crimes and incidents have been influenced by recent recording changes. Monthly levels of both have increased substantially since during the summer of 2003, and subsequently the ratio of crimes to incidents has fallen a little during the last six months.

We have calculated an average and maximum level of crimes to be expected in 2004/05 if NCRS was not present - based on performance during the 36 months prior to April 2003 (namely all the months of 2000/01, 2001/02 and 2002/03).

This provides an approximate range that we can say with some degree of probability that illustrates what crime levels in 2004/05 would be without NCRS. Based on historical trends, crime numbers above these figures are assumed as attributable to NCRS.



Current Crime Levels with NCRS impact removed

Recorded crime during April – July 2004 stands at 11,603 crimes – up 41% on 2001/02 levels (i.e. pre-NCRS), up 35% on 2002/03 levels, and up 19% on 2003/04 levels.

The average monthly crime levels indicate that in an average year around 7,998 crimes might have been expected without NCRS – equating to an average of 1,999 per month.

Similarly, a measure of the maximum likely crime levels records that might be recorded (based on historical performance) a total of 9,424 crimes might be expected without the impact of NCRS – a monthly average of 2,356 offences.

Making the assumption that NCRS is responsible for the crimes recorded above these totals provides an approximate range of impact. Consequently NCRS is estimated as being attributable for a range between a minimum of 19% and 31% of total current crime during 2004/05.

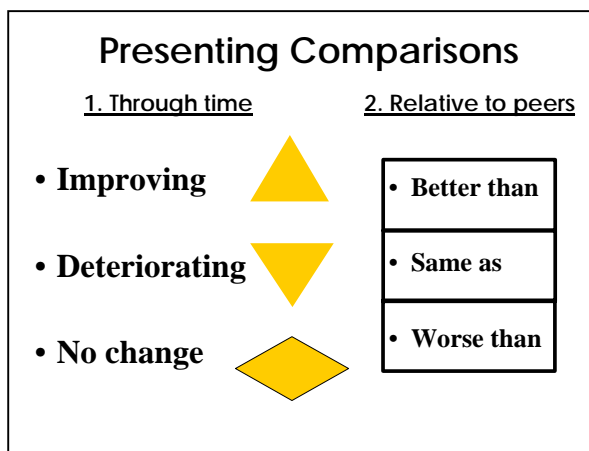
Presenting Performance Comparisons

The method outlined here represents a measure of improving or deteriorating performance – combined with a measure of peer comparison.































Simple arrow directions indicate improving and deteriorating performance, and a series of boxes illustrate performance relative to peers (most similar forces and BCU's).

If performance remains above its peers then the top box is used as an indicator, with the middle and lower boxes used to symbolise performance the same as or worse than peers.

The latest data comparisons have recorded a shift toward a more stable pattern of offences in violent crime. This is together with an improvement in autocrime in Carmarthenshire and other burglary in Powys.
