<p>The RADIATION, CHEMICAL and EXPLOSIVES hazard markers should be added to the vehicle report if the presence of such substances in the vehicle at the time of the theft or other incident is confirmed, and in such a quantity as to pose a hazard to anyone having cause to deal with the vehicle, and for no other reason.</p> <p>The CHEMICAL or EXPLOSIVES markers should not be added merely to indicate the presence of the fuel or other liquids, such as battery acid or brake fluid, normally found as part of the vehicle.</p> <p>It is good practice when adding the chemical hazard to add the name of the chemical and its effect to the text of the report, e.g. corrosive, toxic. If known the "HAZCHEM" code could be added to assist when other emergency services are involved.</p> <p>The OCCUPANTS POTENTIALLY DANGEROUS marker should be used in circumstances where the occupants of the vehicle have used or threatened violence.</p> <p>The WEAPONS marker should be used where it is alleged that the occupants of the vehicle may be in possession of weapons. If the WEAPONS marker is used it must include as much detail as possible about the specific weapon used or seen.</p> <p>If it follows that if the WEAPONS hazard marker is added to a vehicle report the OCCUPANTS POTENTIALLY DANGEROUS marker should also be used.</p> <p>Where firearms are involved, the report must contain details of the type of offence involved and what action is to be taken if such a vehicle is stopped. The firearm must be described in as much detail as possible.</p>
